### 8 Wing blows United Way goal out of the water

Campaign skips from \$93,000 with three weeks remaining to \$139,000 at campaign's end

he United Way team finished L in spectacular fashion at 8 Wing/CFB Trenton this year raising an amazing \$139,000.

Campaign co-leaders Maj. Al Merilainen and Maj. Jay Burt final total of the campaign, especially since three weeks before the end, the total was at \$93,000 and they were afraid they would not meet their goal of \$120,000.



Lt.-Col. Elizabeth Cameron, 8 Wing Administration Officer, thanked the union members and Camp Maple Leaf executive for their efforts on behalf of the eties and Boys and Girls Clubs. Wing Commander, and on behalf of the children belonging to military families.

"I wasn't aware how much our children are benefitting, so thank you very much for what you do," she told those gathered. "Thank you for your hard work and generosity in raising that money. It's absolutely fantastic!"

"It's a great pleasure for UA to be able to help out and you have our support. With our contractors that are involved, we have ward," he stated.



Dormant nests of bees warmed to the atmosphere in the building and the canopy of the aircraft was suddenly filled with bumble bees trying to get out. Once these uninvited guests were disposed of, the ATESS personnel got to work repairing the aircraft.

In August of this year, 8 Wing Commander Col. David Lowthian was made aware of the project by Wing Chief Warrant Officer (WCWO) Sandor Gyuk shortly after his arrival in Trenton. A chat with Mayor Ellis at a function shortly thereafter resulted in the project being brought back onto the front burner.

### Popular new teaching tool introduced at École Secondaire Marc Garneau

Flashover video game proves popular with 10 to 14 year old students

Ecole Secondaire Marc Garneau became the first Quinte area school to make use of a new teaching tool introduced to the area by the Quinte West Fire Department which is proving popular among students 10 to 14 years of

The new teaching tool is a fire safety and prevention education video game which harnesses this new medium while delivering life-saving messaging and skills to young audiences as they play.

Discovered originally by Quinte West Fire Prevention Officer Robert Comeau at a fire education seminar, the game was introduced to Marc Garneau Tuesday morning (Dec. 17). Students were given the opportunity to trial the game while Veronica Cole, the co-founder and Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the educational game development studio, Squabble Studios, visited the school.

It was one of those situations that proved profitable and educational for everybody involved. Mr. Comeau was proud and happy to see the game introduced at a Quinte West school. The students at Marc Garneau enjoyed being on the cutting edge of the newest education techniques. And Veronica Cole revealed, "This is the

first time we've been in a school to see children using Flashover and to get direct feedback from the students."

Comeau was impressed with the game from the beginning. "I was at a fire education seminar and Veronica was there with her team demonstrating the game in their virtual studio. I tried it and immediately wanted to use it to promote fire safety to kids," he enthused.

According to Ms. Cole, there are several reasons that the company and the game targets students from 10 to 14 years of

"This age group starts staying home alone, learning (how) to cook, doing all those different activities where they are at more risk for accidents to happen and they are more the age group to game, as well," she explained.



Ms. Cole noted at Marc Garneau that a new holiday edition of the game was being introduced within the next few days and students using this game would learn things like the importance of keeping a Christmas tree watered properly and keeping it away from a heat source.

"This initiative is already being used by other fire departments in Ontario, but nothing locally," Quinte West Fire Chief John Whelan stated. "With today's technology, we need to be proactive and find new ways in educating the younger generation."

Squabble Studios is an educational game development studio, focused on creating highly educational and entertaining video games as an interactive medium to deliver educational content and messaging. Squabble Studios officially launched Flashover<sup>TM</sup>: The Fire Safety Video Game in October, 2013.

Ms. Cole noted there had been a lot of preliminary generally positive.




