## 8 ACCS adopts a new Gypsy son, bids farewell to a fond daughter

Former Hon. Col. was given an abrupt insight into the life of military personnel

Few Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) Honorary Colonels get to see the military displaying their many and varied skills as did Loyalist College President Maureen Piercy as Honorary Colonel of 8 Air Communication and Control Squadron (8 ACCS).

Hon. Col. Piercy, on a flight to Resolute Bay in 2011 to take part in an operation, found herself witnessing the men and women of the military instead responding to an actual disaster as a civilian aircraft crashed prior to the runway.

"It was a tragic civilian air disaster and I witnessed these people responding with exemplary skill, teamwork and compassion," she said of the shocking incident.

During her five-year term as Honorary Colonel, Hon. Col. Piercy remembers the many events she took part in with the Gypsy Squadron at 8 ACCS, including the repatriation ceremonies, BOXTOP, a trip to Alert, the dedication of the Afghanistan Repatriation Memorial, and the Community Appreciation Rally held in Quinte West in 2010.

## Ethics program designed to give personnel tools for best ethical choice option

Top-down motivation important for the implementation of a decision-making process

Their motto is "Doing the right things right," and the Ethics Program is really about making people aware of a process they can go through to come up with the best ethical choice.

An ethics workshop at 8 Wing is held twice yearly to help unit coordinators improve

their facilitating skills so they can run small group discussions that deliberate on the best courses of action to take when facing various ethical dilemmas. The workshop also reviews the orders and directives that exist on ethical issues, including most importantly the Code of Values and Ethics that all CAF members and DND civilian employees must follow.

"The expectation is that any supervisor can facilitate an ethical dilemma discussion, but a lack of training may create a reluctance to try it," Maj. Tucker stated. "We run this workshop to try to pass on some facilitating skills."

8 Wing is the only air base that has a workshop which tries to train people in ethics

# Great Escape museum display reveals details of heroic escape attempt

Realistic two-level display depicts incredibly detailed escape plan as it actually took place

They came, they saw, they admired!

Men who actually spent time in Stalag Luft III – site of The Great Escape movie as well as the real life escape of 76 prisoners from a German prisoner of war (POW) camp, deemed impossible to escape from by its German builders – and members of the Royal Air Force Escaping Society (RAFES) paid a visit to the National Air Force Museum of Canada (NAFMC) April 24 to celebrate the opening of the new display of Stalag Luft III and the tunnel they used to escape.

It was a magnificent display, on two levels of the museum, which had the special guests crowded around trying to get a first glimpse of the display. The upper display features a prisoner working on documents while the lower display shows men climbing down into the tunnel and excavating "Harry", the tunnel that was finally used to get the 76 men out.

In describing the night of the escape before the official unveiling of the display, Museum Curator Kevin Windsor had a hard time keeping his voice from breaking as he described the challenges they faced and the obstacles they encountered in trying to get men through the tunnel.

Perhaps most startling of all was the fact the tunnel was actually three metres short of the forest they had been aiming for when it was finally discovered by a perimeter guard who almost stepped into the tunnel.

Roy Brown, a member of the RAFES, never spent time in Stalag Luft III, although he did spend a month in a POW camp in Brussels prior to escaping and finally getting back to England. However, he was thrilled with the display calling it "excellent."

Brian Floody, whose father is depicted working in the tunnel and who was the model for the Charles Bronson character in the movie, was impressed with the display and how much the depiction of his father actually resembled him.

"It looks a lot like him," he said. "It's just a great display."

Another man attending had acted as a "penguin" for the project, carrying out bags of excavated earth under his trousers and distributing it onto the grounds of the camp several times. He said the display was very realistic and wonderfully done.

Immediately after the display was unveiled, all of the special visitors for the evening approached the upper display and joined Mr. Windsor in viewing it. Their eyes sparkled and all of them kept looking and pointing

out details to their comrades, all the time saying what a great display it was to Mr. Windsor.

Chris Colton, Executive Director of the NAFMC, noted the museum was proud to unveil this newest display in the newly refurbished museum, although they expected to have many others to reveal to the public in the future.

Nine Canadians took part in the escape, six of whom were shot upon recapture. Of the 76 who actually exited the tunnel, only three actually made it. Of the other 73 rounded up by the guards, an enraged Hitler had 50 of them executed in small groups as a deterrent for future escape attempts.

# Wet lift refuels Alert during Operation BOXTOP

8 Wing Imaging and members of the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) arrived with their B-25 (Arctic) kit in Thule, Greenland on April 12 for Operation BOXTOP (Op BOXTOP) 1/14, and returned back to 8 Wing Trenton on April 26 after successfully completing their mission.

This bi-annual operation supports the sustainment and re-supply of Canadian Forces Station (CFS) Alert and Fort Eureka.

"Once again the professional airmen and airwomen for the Royal Canadian Air Force (RCAF) have proven that even when operating in one of the most challenging environments in the world, the job will get done," said Major Chad Gehl, Air Task Force Commander (ATFC) of BOXTOP, from 426 (Training) Squadron.


Op BOXTOP 1/14 was referred to as a wet lift because the mission was dedicated to the delivery of domestic DF-8 fuel stock from Thule, Greenland to CFS Alert and Eureka, as well as airlift of ultra low sulphur diesel (ULSD) from Resolute Bay, Nunavut to CFS Alert.

To bring fuel to CFS Alert and Eureka, RCAF personnel filled up the wings of CC-130J Hercu-

les (from 436 (Transport) Squadron) and CC-177 Globemaster III (from 429 (Transport) Squadron) aircrafts. Also, the Mobile Air Movements Section (MAMS) and CC-130J Hercules maintainers loaded the CC-130J Bulk Fuel Delivery System (BFDS), permitting the movement of approximately 28,000 pounds of DF-8 fuel per flight.

The off-load of fuel from the wings and BFDS of the CC-130J Hercules as well as the massive amounts of fuel off-loaded from the CC-177 Globemaster III started on April 14. This operation was responsible for delivering the majority of the fuel that is intended to sustain the fuel needs of CFS Alert throughout the year. There was a team of RCAF meteorologists in Thule constantly communicating with the aircrew to make sure that the members fly safely in the world's most northerly permanently inhabited establishments.

Op BOXTOP has been a bi-annual event since the mid-50s with the wet lift occurring in the spring and the dry lift taking place in the fall. This operation remains committed to re-supplying fuel and dry goods to CFS Alert and Eureka to sustain Canadian presence at the top of the world.

# Instrument Flight Rules Control Centre (IFRCC) Training

The Instrument Flight Rules Control Centre (IFRCC) consists of two trades working together: Aerospace Telecommunication and Information System (ATIS) technicians and Air Traffic Controllers (ATC). The ATCs perform their duties using equipment that the ATIS technicians maintain and repair.

After the junior technicians finish their electronics training at the Canadian Forces School of Communications and Electronics (CFSCE) in Kingston, Ont., they complete on-the-job training with Wing Telecommunications and Information Services Squadron (WTISS). The technicians spend the next year working in the different WTISS sections. During their time at the IFRCC, qualification level (QL) 5 qualified technicians teach 3 apprentices maintenance procedures on navigational equipment.

There is a wide range of radars, radios, voice switch equipment, aircraft landing aids, voice recording servers and meteorological equipment that needs to be maintained. All are tied to powerful servers that read the sensor devices and output information displayed on four computers that ATCs use to control Trenton's aerospace.

To properly train an apprentice technician during their rotation at the IFRCC, they accompany qualified technicians for regular preventative maintenance on the airfield



equipment. They repeatedly carry out alignments until they have a good understanding of the procedures and the impact the equipment has on 8 Wing Operations. You will see an example of weekly night maintenance being performed on the Primary and Secondary Surveillance Radars in the provided pic-

ture. There are several signals that need to be adjusted and verified throughout the system, using an oscilloscope. Signals are probed within the radar to make sure the voltages and pulse spacings are correct. Once apprentice technicians complete a pre-set amount of maintenance, they are quizzed on the knowledge they have ob-

tained during the past two months. When supervisors are confident they meet the standard, they are recommended for formal QL5 training. Once completed, they will be trained through specialized equipment maintainer courses that further teach them how to understand, maintain and repair equipment.

# CFB Trenton to commemorate the National Day of Honour

The men and women of 8 Wing/CFB Trenton and the City of Quinte West will join the rest of Canada in commemorating the National Day of Honour on May 9, which has been declared by the Government of Canada to mark the end of our country's military mission in Afghanistan.

There will be two major events in Quinte West, which will be held at the Afghanistan Repatriation Memorial (ARM) in Bain Park. The first event is the start of the Soldier On Afghanistan Commemoration Relay on May 4 at 9 a.m. and culminating with the parade on May 9 at 1 p.m., with a moment of silence at 1:30 p.m., which coincides with the event at the National Capital Region.

These events at the ARM express our appreciation of the support to the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) provided by Canadians throughout the military mission in Afghanistan.

Members of the local communities are invited to take part in these events to commemorate the National Day of

Honour. The events will also pay tribute to the fallen, the sacrifices of the wounded, and the special burden borne by families.

Starting at 8 Wing/CFB Trenton as the primary point of return for CAF deployed personnel, the Soldier On Afghanistan Commemoration Relay will pay respect to those who paid the ultimate sacrifice and travelled down the Highway of Heroes. This relay of the last Canadian flag flown in Afghanistan, which will be passed from an injured member to another, symbolizes resiliency, courage, and perseverance. The relay will travel from Quinte West to Kingston and further onto Ottawa.

As the hub of air transport operations, 8 Wing is involved in virtually every CAF operation. Most personnel and equipment deployed to any destination within Canada or around the world pass through Trenton at some point.



# Calling "Time Out" on anger

Anger is a natural emotion just like happiness and sadness.

The average person experiences one anger related incident each day and will become annoyed at least 20 times each week. Some anger generating situations are unavoidable. When this is the case, an escape strategy such as a time out is one option to reduce the tension.

A time out is taken when you need to take time to step back from a

stressful situation, to think about what you want to say and do next. Time out gives you an opportunity to collect your thoughts and plan ahead, to use coping thoughts and to return to the situation in a calmer manner.

A time out can be as short as five minutes, and as long as you need. The key is to know when you need to take a time out. Awareness of the need for a time out will make a tremendous difference in how you respond to stressful situations.

#### Time out tips:

Time outs can be used spontaneously; for example, by excusing oneself to go to the wash-

room during a heated meeting at work. Time out can be a planned strategy; for example, between spouses who have a prior agreement to respectfully disengage if a disagreement about a sensitive subject begins to escalate into an argument.

During a time out, if possible, do some physical activity like walking or working out to relieve tension in the body.

It is very important to return to the situation to address it, as soon as possible. However, if the situation is particularly intense, it may be useful to schedule a later time to return to the problem.

Time out gives you the opportunity to relax, problem solve and implement coping thoughts.

You may believe that backing away will label you "weak," making you feel like you are giving in, but is this what is really happening? Often, it is the strongest thing you can do. Anybody can stay angry and act out their anger, it takes a much stronger person to back away and think about what is happening.

## Prendre une « pause » quand la colère se pointe

Tout comme la joie et la tristesse, la colère est une émotion naturelle. En moyenne, les gens vivent chaque jour un incident suscitant de la colère et ils se sentent irrités au moins vingt fois par semaine. Il est parfois impossible d'éviter les situations qui provoquent de la colère. Dans de tels cas, une stratégie d'évitement, par exemple prendre une « pause », peut constituer une solution pour réduire la tension.

Prenez une pause lorsque vous avez besoin de prendre du recul devant une situation stressante, afin de réfléchir à ce que vous voulez dire ou faire ensuite. La pause vous offre la possibilité de reprendre vos esprits, de prévoir la suite, d'utiliser des pensées d'adaptation et de replonger dans la situation en étant plus calme.

La pause peut durer aussi peu que cinq minutes, mais être aussi longue que vous le dictent vos besoins. L'essentiel, c'est que vous sachiez à quel moment vous devez en prendre une. En étant conscient de la nécessité de prendre une pause, vous réagirez complètement différemment aux situations stressantes.

#### Conseils sur la pause

Vous pouvez faire une pause spontanément, comme aller à salle de toilettes pendant une réunion surchauffée. Il peut également s'agir d'une stratégie planifiée, par exemple entre deux conjoints qui ont conclu au préalable de mettre fin à une discussion de manière respectueuse si

un désaccord à propos d'un sujet délicat commence à se transformer en dispute.

Faites une activité physique pendant une pause, comme marcher ou vous entraîner, afin d'éliminer la tension physique.

Il est très important de revenir le plus tôt possible à la situation pour régler le problème. Toutefois, si la situation est particulièrement tendue, il peut être utile de se laisser plus de temps.

La pause vous permet de vous détendre, de résoudre les problèmes et de mettre en œuvre les pensées d'adaptation.

Peut-être pensez-vous que si vous prenez du recul, les autres vous jugeront comme une personne « faible » et que vous aurez l'impression de céder, mais est-ce vraiment ce qui se produit? C'est souvent en agissant de cette façon que vous ferez le plus preuve de force. Tout le monde peut rester en colère et exprimer ce sentiment. Il faut être beaucoup plus solide pour prendre ses distances et réfléchir aux événements.

# 24 CF Health Services promotes tobacco-free lifestyle

On April 1 of this year, 24 CF Health Services at CFB Trenton made a strong move which aligned themselves with other provincial and federal health care facilities by designating their clinic property as a tobacco free area.

The Centre's Commanding Officer, Lt.-Cdr. Gord Peckham, and Wing Surgeon, Maj. Nathan Nugent, both felt it important as health care providers to demonstrate a strong commitment to promoting good health and health care practices, thus developing a policy designating clinic grounds as tobacco free - including e-cigarettes and other tobacco products.

In an address to his staff, Lt.-Cdr. Peckham recognized a commander's responsibility for the reduction of health risks to non-smokers and stated smoke-free grounds are the new reality.

"Smoke-free grounds policies can reduce exposure to second-hand smoke, encourage smokers to quit and help make non-smoking the norm," he said, adding health care professionals have a responsibility to discourage tobacco use and provide support to tobacco users who are trying to quit. He asked for effort to be made to ensure all members who use tobacco products be counselled regarding the benefit of ceasing tobacco use and offered effective treatments and therapeutic interventions to assist them in quitting. This is in line with CF H Svcs Gp Instruction 4200-05 Provision of Smoking Cessation Medications to Eligible CAF Personnel.

It is a common practice for facilities transitioning to tobacco free properties to put cessation support programs in place to support patients and staff. The leadership was quick to promote the services of Strengthening the Forces and the Butt Out Program and requested additional resources to promote tobacco cessation be made available.

8 Wing/CFB Trenton Health Promotion utilized the many resources made available to them by the Addictions Awareness and



# Lange & Fetter Ford grand re-opening a celebration three generations in the making

Members of the Lange & Fetter Motors Ford dealership cut a blue ribbon to celebrate the opening of their new location on Wednesday, April 23 in front of a packed house of friends, family members and local dignitaries. It was a celebration of cars, customers, and the dealership's deep-rooted commitment to the Trenton community. Lange & Fetter first opened at 52 Dundas St. E., just east of the downtown bridge, in 1953 as a Ford dealership, and has stayed at its current location ever since.

Plans for the current building began a couple years ago and construction was completed this winter, not long before Wednesday's grand re-opening. Interestingly, the family that runs the business is also into a third generation.

The dealership was founded by the late Vagn Lange and John Fetter. It's now owned by Vagn's son Rick Lange. And Rick's daughter, Stephanie Lange, is now the sales director. Fetter left the business in the mid 1970s, but the Lange family decided to keep his name on the title as a lasting tribute to his work.

The families remain friends and John Fetter, now at age 92, attended the grand re-opening to reminisce with old friends and celebrate the dealership's success.

"It's beautiful," Fetter said of the new facility after walking around the showroom and looking at old photographs. "It's a far cry from what we had."

Rick Lange said he's proud of the new facility and the fact that the businesses has been able to stay in the same location for more than 60 years.

"The location is an excellent location," he said, noting that it's easily visible to downtown drivers. "Historically, this is where it started and I was happy to keep it here. I can't think of a reason to bring it out of downtown. Our customers know where we are."

Lange believes part of the reason why the business has lasted is because customers appreciate buying cars from

a family-run operation that can offer consistent staff. The dealership employees about 35 workers, including people in sales and service and many of them have been with the dealership for several years.

When asked what the secret to success is, Lange gave a frank and honest answer. "I don't think there's any magic; it's just been a matter of trying to stay current and offering quality service,"

he said, noting that the service does not stop once the customer buys a car. The staff and service team work to ensure they get the most out of their vehicle.

The fact that the dealership sells quality vehicles, helps, too. Lange said he's also proud of the fact that the dealership has remained with Ford all this time, noting the auto company's innovation and ability to always turn out new products.

In a speech as part of the grand re-opening celebration, Mike Herniak, Ford's general manager for Eastern Market, pointed out that Ford has been the top selling automobile brand in Canada for the past four years.

One of its signature products, the F150 pick up truck, continues to be a top seller, but the company expects to put out several new models over the next year.

This success, Herniak said, is thanks to customers and dealership owners and staff members, such as those at Lange & Fetter Motors, who are committed to the products. "The thing that differentiates us from others is that we're still a family run company," Herniak said.

When Rick Lange spoke at the podium, he thanked his staff, customers, and municipal officials who worked with them on the redevelopment of, not only the lot, but the stretch of Dundas Street East. It was repaved and widened recently to make room for the new dealership and other businesses.

"I hope we're here for another 60 years," he said.

facilitation, Maj. Tucker noted.

The role of Wing Ethics coordinators is to compile the statistics gathered by unit

like Maj. Tucker and Mrs. Arlene Preston

ethics coordinators about how well 8 Wing units are doing with their ethics program. They are also an office where a person can get clarification for grey areas which may exist within some Department of National Defence (DND) policies.

“Unit programs are the Commanding Officer’s program and they are the one out there having to sell it so the non-commissioned members (NCMs) and junior officers get a sense of how important ethics is and how important it is to actually practice a decision-making process,” noted Maj Tucker.

The Wing coordinators are here to assist units to get an ethics program of education and awareness in place so that everyone knows the expected behaviours based on the three principles and five values of the Department’s Code of Values and Ethics and knows a decision making model for when they are faced with an ethical dilemma. For 2013, 8 Wing reported 82 per cent of personnel were exposed to ethics training/awareness through briefings, ethical scenario discussions, and the DND Learn on-line ethics course or the one-day local Trenton Continuous Improvement Office (TRCIO) ethics course. Units reported 60 leadership engagements whereby COs ran a session or put out a communiqué. “Commanding Officers have a written plan on how they will implement an ethics program in their units and now it’s about getting those units to get 100 per cent facilitated discussion participation,” Maj. Tucker noted.

“Equally important in an ethics program is the need for leaders to ensure a healthy climate for encouraging the reporting of wrongdoing and ensuring no reprisals. Each individual unit’s chain of command is responsible for both implementing a unit ethics program and for the discipline and ethical conduct going on in their units,” Maj. Tucker stated.

The Department has a nation-wide whistle-blowing program that ensures the

identity of the whistle-blower is kept confidential, provided they are reporting in good faith.

“Individuals are always encouraged to report to their chain of command their concerns, but they can also report directly to the Internal Disclosure Office in NDHQ and as well here at 8 Wing, we have also assigned a role to unit ethics coordinators to act as intermediaries to whom whistle-blowers may approach with the information they have and then the coordinators will uphold the confidentiality of the whistleblower when delivering the information to the appropriate chain of command. After all, what is important is stopping the unethical conduct, knowing who reported it is not,” noted Maj. Tucker.



Prevention Cell with Force Health Protection and created a specific package aimed at progressing tobacco users through the stages of change towards abstinence. Community Health Nurses Capt. Rémi Pelletier and Capt. Terry Wynn have played important roles as primary points of contact for those members beginning the cessation process.

This is a great example of a leadership driven initiative that moved to create an environment to further support health, CAF health messaging and good health practices in general. It is important to evaluate our environments and reflect on how they may impact the users. The National Addictions Free Lifestyle Working Group, under the direction of Deanne Chafe of Force Health Protection, has been working diligently over the past few years to promote tobacco cessation. They are involved in several initiatives across the many bases and wings as together we move towards tobacco-free living in the Canadian Armed Forces.


