Elephant Walk boosts the pride of 436 (T) Squadron

The 436 (Training) Squadron Elephant Walk on Sept. 11 garnered the 8 Wing/CFB Trenton, the squadron and everyone involved words of praise from some very heavy hitters in the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF).

Even as 8 Wing Commander Colonel (Col.) Colin Keiver expressed his pride at accomplishing the launch of 10 CC-130J Hercules one after the other, he noted that he had already sent photographs from the event to Lieutenant-General Michael Hood, who termed it "awesome."

An Elephant Walk has not been done in 20 years at CFB Trenton and it made Col. Keiver proud to the bursting point, he told squadron members late in the day after the event.

"First of all, it means the world to be standing back here in this bay where I use to stand with all of you not that long ago when I was commanding officer and I just want to say I'm so proud of each and every single one of you! I really am. You made me burst today. It's an incredible Air Force Day, it's an incredible 8 Wing Day, it's an incredible 436 Squadron day! Thank you immensely for giving me that because I'll launch into the weekend immensely proud of what you've done. You should be so proud of yourselves!" he stated.

There are a multitude of reasons to hold an elephant Walk, according to 436 (T) Squadron

Chief Warrant Officer (CWO) Stu Preston.

"In a nut-shell, the Elephant Walk was planned and conducted in order to exercise and challenge certain capabilities within 436 (T) Sqn. and 8 Wing," he noted after the event. "It was done to challenge the squadron's maintenance's ability to prepare and surge a large number of service-

able aircraft, to test the ability to facilitate rapid launch of many aircraft, to challenge squadron staff to plan and coordinate a large scale air mobility mission, to conduct a mass air drop in a safe and effective manner, to exercise the integration of numerous 8 Wing organizations whose cooperation and support are critical in mission success, and fi-

nally, the mission was also aimed at providing a morale boost for 436 (T) Sqn. and the Wing, as it was an undertaking that had not yet been attempted since the introduction of the CC-130J to the RCAF in 2010," CWO Preston indicated.

This special event name comes from the squadron's mascot, the Asian elephant, according to

CWO Preston, who added that a group of taxiing aircraft resemble a herd of elephants.

436 (T) Sqn. Commander Lieutenant-Colonel (Lt.-Col.) Troy Paisley congratulated the squadron personnel on a job well done, adding that the Elephant Walk went very well for those in the planes.

The National Air Force Museum of Canada (NAFMC) took possession of its latest aircraft on Sept. 9 when a CC-144 Challenger, taken out of service by the military a year prior, was delivered to Trenton.

Op BOXTOP testing a new CONOPS this year

Operation BOXTOP (Op BOX-TOP), a biannual resupply of Canadian Forces Station Alert, is experiencing a different concept of operations (CONOPS) this year.


According to Capt. Candice Thompson, Deputy Operations Officer of 2 Air Movements Squadron (2 Air Mov), Op BOXTOP has had to go about their resupply of Alert in an entirely different manner this year.

“Historically, the CONOPS for Op BOXTOP is to consolidate the cargo in Montreal and send it by sea to Thule, Greenland,” Capt. Thompson indicated. “Once it arrives, the cargo is moved from Thule to Alert by air using CC-130 Hercules. In that case, Mobile Air Movements Section (MAMS) teams would be positioned in Thule to take the cargo from the ship and build it up on aircraft pallets, and in Alert to offload and break down the inbound CC-130 loads.

“This year, a different CONOPS is being used. Instead of sending cargo by sea, the cargo was sent from Montreal to Trenton by road. In Trenton, a dedicated MAMS team at 2 Air Movements Squadron (2 Air Mov. Sqn.) has been building the cargo on aircraft pallets for shipment by air. This team has

built approximately 60 aircraft pallets, over 280,000 pounds of freight. These pallets are being moved from Trenton to Alert by CC-177 Globemaster III and CC-130s.”

Capt. Thompson noted that existing air mobility tasks were used in many cases to support Op BOXTOP. “For example, Op NANOOK, a large Northern operation, is currently on the redeployment phase, so aircraft heading up to Inuvik to pick up NANOOK cargo are carrying BOXTOP cargo to Alert on the way. This strategy will be used as much as possible in order to maximize airlift capacity,” she explained. In addition to the team working in Trenton, 2 Air Mov. Sqn. has a MAMS team positioned in Alert to offload the inbound cargo. Because the CC-177s have different requirements than the CC-130s usually use, 2 Air Mov. Sqn. has also sent a K-44 aircraft loader to Alert because that particular loader was not available in Alert.





“The planes behaved very well! There are only two unserviceable at the end of this and both are only minor unserviceabilities,” he noted, instructing his air crew to thank their maintenance partners.

“Maintenance, you guys were awesome. You jumped on board and took control and you generated those aircraft. We had 13 aircraft serviceable, I think, three days this week. I don’t think we’ve ever had that, so hats off to you! That’s impressive!” he said, adding that it would not have been possible without the assistance of other partners like 8 AMS, the Lock-

heed Martin Craft Manufacturing and Tooling (CMT) team, Cascade, IMP, 2 AMU and 8 Wing. “I can’t say enough about my maintenance organization.”

CWO Preston was brief but to the point in his praise of his maintainers and his squadron personnel.

“The maintainers and crews made this day happen,” he noted. “You are all professionals and you show it every day. Today would not have happened without that professionalism, period. Thank you! I’m proud to be here and proud to be a part of this and I’m proud of you guys!”

Col. Keiver agreed.

“Troy and the chief are absolutely right. It’s not just about the individuals

in the airplanes or the maintainers; it’s about every single one of you having a huge part in what you’ve done today. I’m so proud of you! Thank you for making the rest of us look like rock stars and my only regret about today is that I wasn’t in one of those airplanes,” he added.

Lieutenant-General (Lt.-Gen.) Joseph

Jacques Charles “Charlie” Bouchard, former commander of 1 Canadian Air Division (1 CAD) and now representing Lockheed Martin, was proud and relieved the event had done as well as it did.

“It’s a great day for 436, 8 Wing Trenton and for Lockheed Martin because we were there to witness this,” he said. “You

do not know how much stress there is until you are a Lockheed Martin person sitting in one of the seats of CC-130 and wondering if it is going to take off today or not. I got to witness today professionalism at its best. You can be justifiably proud of your pilots, of your loadmasters, your technicians, your entire team. It makes me feel proud to be Canadian today to do that!”

Lt.-Gen. Bouchard followed up those remarks by presenting the squadron with a large model of the Lockheed Martin CC-130J 601 model.

being a turkey vulture, which is what this aircraft hit as it was attempting to land in McDill Air Force Base.

"It caused quite a bit of damage to the right side of the aircraft in the ray dome and avionics bay," Lt.-Col. Costelloe related. "The aircraft was flown back to Ottawa, was repaired and returned to service."

Another incident with this aircraft resulted in a service bulletin for all Challengers from Bombardier.

"She was taken out of service last year after a failure with the thrust reversers on the right side," Lt.-Col. Costelloe noted. "The thrust reverser mechanism failed and had sheared. If I remember correctly, it did result in a service bulletin that Bombardier put out for all 600 variant Challengers because of the metal fatigue that they found in the post-incident investigation. It hasn't flown since."

The decision to retire this particular aircraft was made in June of 2014, according to Lt.-Col. Costelloe. Since that decision was made, the aircraft has been sitting for a year with Transport Canada maintaining it in an airworthy state in anticipation

the aircraft was either going to be sold or disposed of in some fashion or another.

"The idea of donating or repurposing the aircraft for the NAFMC occurred over the last year and approval was received in early August to transfer the aircraft to the museum," he said.

A few more inspections were completed to get the aircraft air-worthy for this one-time flight, and a special flight permit was granted for the flight to Trenton on Sept. 9, according to Lt.-Col. Costelloe.

Executive director of the NAFMC Chris Colton proudly took possession of the aircraft late in the morning of Sept. 9 under a cloudy sky which threatened rain at any moment. A brief handing over the key ceremony took place before the flight crew, consisting of Capt. Michael Dunning, Capt. Dave Andrews and Terry Matthews of Transport Canada along with 412 Squadron Honorary Colonel (Hon.-Col.) Al Douquettville and Lt.-Col. Costelloe, were flown back to Ottawa in a sister Challenger.

When asked how that last landing went, Capt. Andrews stated, "It could have been better, but they can always be better," he laughed.

412 Squadron Commanding Officer Lt.-Col. Aidan Costelloe filled out the final flight log entry on CC-144 Challenger 601 after the flight from Ottawa on Sept. 9.



With its three-vehicle garage and optional unfinished basement, this appealing three-bedroom home features plenty of room for future growth.

The front entry is sheltered by a covered verandah with a lofty 11-foot ceiling, which continues into the foyer and great room. Directly ahead is the great room, where French doors open on to a covered deck, also with an 11-foot ceiling, overlooking the back garden. The gas fireplace is flanked by built-in shelving.

Separated from the great room by a work island and four-seat eating bar are the dining area and kitchen, with nine-foot ceilings. The dining area enjoys large win-

dows that look out to the sundeck, an extension of the covered deck. The kitchen pantry is tucked into the angle made by the L-shaped staircase that leads to the optional basement.

The laundry room is conveniently located between the extra-large garage and the kitchen, and includes a coat cupboard. The garage includes an

exit to the side garden, as well as the laundry room.

In the sleeping wing, all ceilings measure nine feet. The master suite overlooks the back garden and includes an ensuite with a soaker tub as well as a shower stall.

The two secondary bedrooms look out to the

front garden and share a three-piece bathroom and a linen closet.

Brick accents enliven the facade's horizontal siding, and wooden shingles decorate the gables. Partly mullioned windows add a touch of old-fashioned charm.

This home measures 64 feet wide and 65 feet, six inches deep, for a total of 1,799 square feet.

8 Wing Firefighters remember 9/11

It was ironic that just as 8 Wing firefighters were beginning a ceremony to remember the 343 New York Fire Department firefighters who died in the 9/11 tragedy, the alarms went off and two thirds of the firefighters on parade were called away on an emergency response.

Hearing those alarms go off just minutes prior to the time the first alarm went off on Sept. 11, 2001 must have sent

chills through those firefighters on parade.

Despite the interruption, the ceremony continued and, along with the firefighters killed in that incident, the ceremony recalled the 2,996 people who lost their lives in total, including the firefighters, the 72 New York police officers, and the 24 Canadians.

8 Wing Deputy Fire Chief Master Warrant Officer (MWO) Rodney Boskovitch outlined the reason for the ceremony just prior to the alarms going off.

"The informal reason we are gathered here this morning is to remember the 2,996 people that lost their lives at the World Trade Centre, the Pentagon and in a field in Pennsylvania," he noted.

Normally held in front of the headquarters building on the south side of the base, this year's ceremony took place at the fire hall due to the construction along Highway 2 at CFB Trenton. Padre Capt. Blair Ross opened the ceremony with a prayer followed by the ringing of a bell at 8:46 a.m. when the first aircraft crashed into the North Tower and at 9:03 a.m. when the second aircraft crashed into the South Tower. Two minutes of silence followed prior to MWO Boskovitch ringing the bell 24 times for each Canadian that lost their lives on that tragic morning. That element of the ceremony was followed by the lament, played by piper MWO Shackleton and then final payer and blessing from Padre Ross.

In a brief gathering after the ceremony, MWO Boskovitch recalled where he was on 9/11 when he heard the news, recalling he did not at first believe the news when he was told about it.

Obituary – Hugh Patrick O’Neil

Mr. O’Neil was a great friend to 8 Wing/CFB Trenton in addition to being a politician who worked tirelessly for his community

8 Wing/CFB Trenton is very much saddened to learn that Mr. Hugh Patrick O’Neil died suddenly at his home in Trenton Monday evening at the age of 79. With his passing, the Quinte region has lost a man who helped the community improve in many aspects including military, education, health care, municipal governments, the arts, and clubs and organizations. If help was needed, Mr. O’Neil would be quick to respond and offer his services. Even the day he died, he had been reported to be at a demonstration supporting Trenton Memorial Hospital.
 A genuinely nice man who respected everyone, Mr. O’Neil showed great respect to those people who dedicated their lives to helping and defending others; he was truly a close friend of the military and its personnel.
 Involved in so many aspects of life in the Quinte region, Mr. O’Neil was also an Honorary Colonel of 424 Transport and Rescue Squadron and was one of four honorary fund raising chairs of the National Air Force Museum of Canada. It was Mr. O’Neil who came up with the idea of constructing a lasting memorial to the soldiers killed in Afghanistan; on this initiative he worked tirelessly along with former Quinte West Mayor John Williams and a committee to bring that idea to fruition.
 For those efforts, both Mr. O’Neil and Mr. Williams were presented with the Canadian Forces Medallion at CFB Trenton on Aug. 7, 2013.
 The Canadian Forces Medallion for Distinguished Service

is the highest level of recognition which can be presented to a civilian by the Canadian Armed Forces.
 In presenting the medallions, then Col. Sean Friday noted, “The Canadian Forces Medallion for Distinguished Service is awarded by the Chief of the Defence Staff on behalf of the entire Canadian Forces for a service of rare, exceptionally high standard which accrues great benefit to the Canadian Armed Forces as a whole.”
 Mr. O’Neil’s award read in part, “Mr. O’Neil demonstrated outstanding dedication and perseverance in the creation of the Afghanistan Repatriation Memorial.”

Mr. O’Neil told The Contact after the ceremony he was “totally surprised” by the presentation. “I really had no idea about it.”
 Which was just one other aspect of “Mr. Quinte’s” makeup – he expected nothing in return for his endeavours.
 8 Wing/CFB Trenton Commanding Officer Colonel Colin Keiver noted that the entire base felt the loss of Mr. O’Neil.
 “Our military community lost a champion this week. The passing of our friend and supporter, Mr. Hugh O’Neil, is deeply felt amongst the 8 Wing/CFB Trenton family. On behalf of the members of 8 Wing/CFB Trenton, I offer our deepest condolences to his family and friends during their time of mourning. They are all in our thoughts and prayers.”
 Survived by his wife Donna, son David, daughter Cathy and four grandchildren, Mr. O’Neil will be greatly missed in the greater Quinte region by many who might not even realize he had touched their lives.
 Funeral arrangement have been made by the Weaver Family Funeral home, East Chapel. Visitation will be held Friday, Sept. 18 from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. and 7 p.m. to 9 p.m.


