

The Royal Canadian Air Force recently unveiled the CF-18 Demonstration Jet for its 2016 season.

The unveiling ceremony took place on April 5, at 4 Wing, Cold Lake, Alberta, where the jet was painted over the past few weeks. The wing commander, officials from the City of Cold Lake and the Town of Bonnyville, and Captain (Capt.) Ryan Kean, who will fly the jet, attended.

It gave everyone in attendance a chance to see, for the first time, the CF-18 Hornet design, which commemorates this year's theme: the British Commonwealth Air Training Plan (BCATP).

"It is always a privilege for 4 Wing to be entrusted with the responsibility of designing and preparing the demonstration CF-18, which allows the Royal Canadian Air Force to connect with thousands of Canadians and present them with proud moments of our heritage," said

# Revitalized Cadet Air Rifle championship competition produces strong Ontario team

Approximately 120 cadets and their coaches descended on Trenton from across the province to compete in the Provincial Air Rifle Championship on the weekend.

Competition was amazingly on target, according to Captain (Capt.) Cory Lohnes, Public Affairs Officer (PAO) Regional Cadet Support Unit for central Ontario. The cadets shot from the

prone position on Saturday, and standing on Sunday.

The inclusion of the standing position competition has had an unusual result – it has made the prone position much more competitive, according to Capt. Lohnes.

“Organizers of this event are just amazed at the accuracy demonstrated yesterday in the prone position,” Capt. Lohnes noted. “Competitors seem to know they may not be as accurate while firing

from the standing position, so they really seem to bear down in the prone competition.”

The competition in Trenton was the third of the Canadian Cadet Marksmanship Competition. Once each

series. Cadets winning at the Trenton competition would then advance to the national competition in Gimli, Manitoba.

Even as scores were being posted electronically at the provincial competition, a team was posting them onto a national board and at the same time taking note of similar competitions and scores taking place in other provinces.

The top three teams from this past weekend’s competition are selected to form Team Ontario to advance to the National Championship in Gimli next month. However, the national selection

process then offers the potential for additional teams to be selected as a “wild card.”

Once each

provincial team has been selected, they then rank order the rest of the teams from right across the country (according to their final score) inviting the top four teams – regardless of province – to also compete in the Championship.

“There is still a very good chance that we will get at least one more team from Ontario as our fourth place team from this past weekend is sitting quite high up in the rankings, but Newfoundland & Labrador still have to complete their competition this coming weekend,” stated Capt. Lohnes.

First place on the weekend went to 2799-Queen’s York Rangers RC(Army)CC from Aurora, followed by 856-Pickering Kinsmen RC(Air)CS from Pickering in second, 151-Chadburn RC(Air)CS from Oshawa in third. The fourth place – and thus first stand-by team to be considered for a “Wild Card” was 1596 Royal Highland Fusiliers of Canada RC(Army)CC out of Kitchener.

“The revitalization of the Air Rifle Championship series this year expanded the number of teams that competed in the Stare 2 qualifying round before



The Demo Hornet arrived in Comox, British Columbia, on April 12, 2016 to begin spring training in preparation for the 2016 show season. The Hornet is painted in colours that recall the yellow training aircraft used during the British Commonwealth Air Training Plan, which ran from December 1939 to March 1945. that make up the fabric of the modern RCAF.

These squadrons, which continue to serve Canada and Canadians to this day, came into being as a result of Article XV of the BCATP Agreement.

By the end of the Second World War, the BCATP had produced 131,553 aircrew, including pilots, wireless operators, air gunners, and navigators for the air forces of Great Britain, Australia, New Zealand and Canada. The plan also trained citizens of other nations – including Poland, the United States, Norway, Belgium, the Netherlands, Czechoslovakia and France – who were critical to the war effort. Further, tens-of-thousands of maintainers and support staff were recruited and trained by the RCAF to support the effort; without the contribu-

tion of these civilian men and women, the plan would have failed.

A native of London, Ontario, Capt. Kean joined the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) in 2003 under the Regular Officer Training Plan. In July 2013, he was posted to his current unit, 410 Tactical Fighter (Operational Training) "Cougar" Squadron, as an instructor pilot on the Hornet and is currently the squadron's deputy operations officer. During his time at 4 Wing, Capt. Kean has participated in multiple training missions and exercises all over Canada and the United States. He has also conducted operational missions both at home and overseas in support of NORAD and NATO missions. He has more than 1,600 flying hours on military aircraft, including 1,300

hours on the Hornet.

"I am honored to be representing the Royal Canadian Air Force during this year's airshow season," said Capt. Kean. "I hope to be a source of inspiration to our young Canadians the same way I was inspired myself as a young child. I am looking forward to sharing with them my passion for aviation, hoping to motivate them to reach for their dreams as I did when I decided to become a fighter pilot. "This year's theme also fits well with the

Demonstration team outreach mission as it ties together a pivotal moment in our Air Force's history and its long standing relationship with our communities across Canada."

The specially painted Hornet

features a unique commemorative paint job designed by veteran design director, Jim Belliveau, at 4 Wing.

This decorative aircraft will perform at the Quinte International Air Show on June 25 and 26.

## Lucky landscaper needs to take care of equipment

It's great to work outdoors in the summer - but don't let equipment maintenance slide. If you have landed a landscaping job for the summer, you may be counting yourself lucky. While everyone else you know is indoors sweltering on the plant floor or chilled in an air-conditioned office, you are riding around on a garden tractor enjoying the summer sunshine and fresh breezes.

Mowing, tilling, fertilizing and other landscaping work is often done with motorized equipment. This equipment will run safely and work well if it is maintained regularly. The operating manual supplied by the manufacturer is a gold mine of information about the equipment.

Another valuable document is a detailed record of maintenance. Consider these maintenance tips:

- Keep the engine and the area

around it clean so the engine will run at a lower temperature.

- Use the right kind of oil for the specific model of equipment. Check the oil in hardworking equipment daily.
- Check the operator's manual to make sure you are using the correct coolant and the correct schedule for flushing the radiator. With an air-cooled engine, keep the screen and cooling fins clean.
- Keep an eye on the electrical system so you'll know that wiring is in good condition to prevent shorts and other problems. Never jump-start a tractor from the ground - workers have been run over that way.
- Keep the spark plugs clean and check the battery frequently.
- Be alert to unusual noises in the equipment that may indicate parts are not correctly lubricated or belts are falling apart. Vibration might be a sign of wear in



the transmission or drive shaft. Equipment inspection and repairs may be part of your job if you are qualified, or these tasks may be the responsibility of a maintenance shop. Either way, you should do a safety check of the equipment each time you use it. Make sure tires are properly inflated, and brakes, gears, steering and alarms are all working properly.

That way, the good luck that landed you a landscaping job will continue.

6. 2 to 8 units to help someone with internal bleeding
