

The search is on for models of the Avro Arrow

Raise the Arrow is a search for and recovery of nine Avro Arrow free flight models launched over Lake Ontario in a series of tests during 1954 – 1957.

The models are located somewhere off the coast of Prince Edward County and once recovered, the models will be housed at the Canada Aviation and Space Museum (CASM) in Ottawa and the National Air Force Museum of Canada (NAFMC) here in Trenton.

In the past, privately funded missions have attempted to locate and recover the lost models, but all have failed due to inadequate funding, water depths, search area size and the amount of metal debris on the bottom.

A Commemoration Service like no other

July 1, 2017, Canada 150, a day I soon won't forget! My mother, my husband and I arrived at Green Cove, in Northern Cape Breton for the, Canada Day Sunrise Celebration & Veterans Com-

memoration Service. We were greeted with the sea breeze & bagpipes playing in the background. Fishing boats dotted the rocky shore line as the sun started to peak through the clouds. I have been a military spouse for 42 years and currently live in Trenton, and I can honestly tell you that I have not experienced a veteran's service as emotional or as well done as this one held in this tiny Northern Cape Breton Community, where I grew up.

At 5:15am sharp, the Colour Guard marched on to begin the service. Ray Stapleton provided the opening remarks. I will never forget the pride I felt when O Canada was played and all of the veterans, including my hus-

I knew Terry had his father's Merchant Marine medal tucked into his pocket.

The story of Confederation was explained and a very powerful letter was read, written by a WW 1 Veteran. In Flanders Field was recited leaving many in tears. The guest speaker was Major General Lew MacKenzie (Retd). An incredible speaker, I didn't want

him to stop talking. He taught everyone in attendance so much on the complex issues of peace & war.

Perhaps the most poignant of the ser-

vices was the reading of the Honour

Roll from those North of Smokey dur-

ing WW1, WW2 & the Korean Conflict

and the Act of Remembrance read by

Veteran Douglas Briand, as he faced

the rugged sea, was very emotional

with the reality of war really start-

ing to become clear. It was obvious

the planning committee spent many,

many hours planning this very special

event.

As mentioned earlier my mother,

Mary Brewer, 93, from Ingonish was in

attendance. One of the few WW2 veter-

ans widows still alive, she had with

her my father's medals. My father,

James Brewer, Gunner, was wounded

while in action. He was sent home

an! How proud I am to be Canadi-

ans!

On September 27th, 1944. My mother

received only a telegram saying her husband was wounded in action. No further information was available at that time. It wasn't until much later she learned he was still alive and was told she could not meet him in Halifax for security reasons.

There are two highlights that will never be forgotten. The first was the time and interest paid by Major General Lew MacKenzie (Retd) to my mother.

At one point, he took out his own personal camera to capture a moment of the two of them together. The second

was by Constable Kevin Devoe, a true ambassador for the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP). He too, very

much enjoyed the stories shared by my mother. At one point he placed his arms gently around her, told her how sweet she was & gently kissed her on the head. My mom told me later this act of kindness brought a tear to her eye.

Truly, this honouring of our Veterans was a service I wish every Canadian

could have experienced on Canada

150! How proud I am to be Canadian!

How proud I am to be a Veterans

daughter & wife!



2 Air Movements members assure firefighting equipment makes it to Operation LENTUS

On July 18, a MAMS team from 2 Air Movements Squadron departed 8 Wing Trenton for Sudbury, Ontario on short notice to help load important emergency response and firefighting equipment destined to help in Operation LENTUS, the Canadian Armed Forces contribution to help fight forest fires burning in British Columbia.

The team, consisting of Corporal (Cpl.) Jonathan Fafard, Cpl. Christopher McNulty, Cpl. Cedrick L. Filion, Private Annick Pichette, Aviator (Avr.) Jacqueline Eddy and Avr. Tasheena Logan, made contact with local handlers who were part of the emergency response team, and began to build the aircraft pallets which consisted of equipment for firefighters.

The team built six aircraft pallets, totalling 19050 kilograms. The next day the plane was loaded and departed for Prince George, B.C.



Safety Get the Upper Hand on Cuts



What's at Stake? Your hands and fingers help you complete almost every task you do throughout your day. Starting with hitting the snooze button in the morning all the way through to setting your alarm at night, you rely on your hands and fingers more than you probably realize. Hand and finger injuries can range from a minor inconvenience to a life-altering event.

What's the Danger? Since your hands are involved in almost everything you do, they are vulnerable to injuries like cuts and lacerations. In fact, cuts are one of the most common causes of workplace injuries.

Common cut injuries include:

- Scratches and abrasions.
- Minor cuts requiring first aid.
- Needle sticks and Puncture wounds.
- Deep lacerations that require stitches.
- Amputations.

You run the risk of infection if you don't properly clean and care for a cut, abrasion or other wound to your hand or finger. That's one of the reasons you should always report any injury, no matter how minor, to your supervisor.

Common causes for cuts, abrasions, puncture wounds and amputations include:

- Lack of training or improper training.
- Lack of experience.
- Rushing, taking shortcuts, or not paying attention to your task.
- Not following safety rules, not wearing the correct personal protective equipment, or not wearing any personal protective equipment (PPE).
- Using the wrong tool for the task.
- Removing machine guards or using machines with missing guards.
- Handling sharp objects with your hands instead of using tools or equipment. For example, picking up broken glass with your hands instead of using a broom and dust pan to clean up.
- Working in an area that doesn't have adequate lighting or has reduced visibility.
- Working on or around machines that have not been properly locked and tagged out.

How to Protect Yourself - Here are 10 ways to protect against cuts and lacerations—one for each finger.

1. Attend training.
2. Ask questions if you aren't sure how to perform a task safely.
3. Never bypass machine or equipment guards.
4. Never use machines or equipment with missing guards.
5. Never bypass the lockout/tagout on a machine or piece of equipment.
6. Keep your hands out of danger areas, such as the point of operation of a machine and all moving parts.
7. Keep tools and equipment well maintained.
8. Don't use damaged or broken tools.
9. Use the right tool for the task and use it safely.
10. Always wear appropriate gloves and other required protective equipment.

FINAL WORD Even though cuts and lacerations are one of the leading causes of workplace injuries, you can get the upper hand by following safe work practices and always wearing protective equipment!

ATTENTION JUNIOR OFFICERS

In order to successfully lead the RCAF into and beyond 2030, you must have an Airpower mindset, pursue air power mastery and understand as much about the RCAF as possible. The challenge is balancing operational requirements with your responsibility to study and prepare for these demands. To ease the burden, there have been some significant improvements to help you get ready to lead the RCAF of 2030. Here are a couple of examples.

AIR FORCE OFFICER DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

Broadens your knowledge of RCAF Officer roles at the tactical, operational and strategic levels.

- Broken into 5 manageable blocks.
- Blocks 1-4 reduced from 240 to 135 hours to complete.
- Self-enroll and take Blocks 1, 2 and 4 online.
- Block 5: 2-week in-house course at Canadian Forces School of Aerospace Studies.

CANAIRGEN 015/17 announced that completion of AFOD is mandatory for promotion to Major for most Air Force trades starting with the Fall 2018 selection merit boards.

AIRPOWER OPERATIONS COURSE

After completing AFOD Block 5, you could be nominated to this new and demanding six-week residential course delivered by the Canadian Forces Aerospace Warfare Centre in Trenton to develop:

- airpower mindedness;
- integrated air operations;
- staff officer duties;
- tasking air power to conduct integrated air operations;
- executing integrated air operations; and
- assessing operational effectiveness.

CANAIRGEN 015/17 announced that APOC grads in most Air Force trades will be awarded section criteria (SCRIT) points starting with Fall 2018 selection merit boards.

Engage Excite and Empower through Operation Motorsport

Operation Motorsport is Canadian veteran owned, not for profit, with charitable status, based in Brighton, Ontario and was founded on the basis of three simple words; Excite, Engage, Empower. The premise is to engage, through motorsport activities, ill and injured service members and disabled veterans, affected by military service, leading to aiding in their recovery and rehabilitation.

"I'm a 35 year veteran with the Canadian Army, physically unscathed, and my re-integration into something other than military, was motorsports," said Martin 'Diezel' Lodder, co-founder and future CEO, who also says Operation Motorsport is about being part of a family with end goals much the same way as being part of the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) life, or in many cases, was; for members who can no longer serve and need a place to feel welcomed.

With their status, the Department of National Defence (DND) and the Military Family Resource Centre (MFRC) send members their way, rather than the operation having to go in search of military people on their way out.

"Sports are one of the best forms of rehabilitation, and motorsports is just another form," said Lodder who wants service members whether they have spent 25 years or 25 months in the service of their country, to come check out his operation. "This sport is also an equalizer, you don't have to worry about running or jumping, or things that may hold you back from being active."

It is also the hope that those who decide to seek out Motorsport, find something that speaks to them,

whether it's getting behind the wheel, being a photographer, helping in the garage, or being part of the PR campaign. The idea is that everyone who comes to the sport is once again equal, part of a family unit and perhaps, during that adjustment period, see something within that will lead them to search out a new path in their lives, while knowing they are always part of the team.

"We're about wants and needs, someone who comes to us may not want a new career, they may want a diversion. Then you have the other side who need something, they've been medically released after 10 years and they need to find a new career path, we're here to help them see their potential," explained Lodder who also noted that just like in the military, this operation will be never ending.

8 Wing Pipes and Drums become grade 4 Canadian Champions





But part of that dilemma is about to change as OEX Recovery Group Incorporated, in sponsorship with Osisko Mining Incorporated along with Osisko Gold Royalties Ltd, is now onboard. They also bring a slew of financial support from several major organizations across Canada which include, National Bank, Bank of Montreal, CASM, Royal Canadian Air Force (RCAF), Canadian Coast Guard, The Royal Canadian Military Institute; just to name a few.

The models which lay at the bottom of the lakes, are one-eighth scale replicas of the famed flying jet, and were part of the final flight design test work done prior to the production of the CF-105 Arrow. The only known artifacts from the Avro Arrow program remaining to be found are the free flight test models. The condition of the models is unknown.

Maintaining fitness at Canadian Forces Station (CFS)

Alert can be difficult, at times, due to cold weather and other challenges. However, station members find many different ways to stay active. One of the most popular fitness activities that occurs at the Station is ball hockey.

Three nights a week, from 7 p.m. to 8:30 p.m., the CFS Alert main gym hosts an intense bout of ball hockey. The games are well attended; usually around fifteen people join in, making up about a sixth of the station's entire personnel. The players show up early to warm up while the goalies get dressed, and as soon as they're ready a pile of the players' hockey sticks is separated into two groups to decide the teams. Teams are allowed to have four players and one goalie, on the floor at all times, so any of the extra players wait on the sidelines for substitutions. The game is won when one of the teams reaches five goals, then the teams shake hands and switch sides for the next game.

The group is usually able to play three full games, at which point most of the players are exhausted and ready to pack it in.

Many of the station's civilian and military staff are experienced ice hockey players, and so the games are always quite competitive. Visitors who join in are often impressed with the skill and effort on display, but also recognize the high level of sportsmanship that is necessary. In a physical sport like hockey, it can be easy for competition to turn into aggression, and for aggression to turn into injuries, so roughness and foul play are strictly forbidden. If one team is struggling to keep up against the other, the teams are changed up accordingly. Station members all treat each other like family, and so any rivalries that are developed in the games are always left behind on the court.

Ball hockey is an important part of life at Alert. Getting the chance to participate in a high-intensity competition three times a week is a great opportunity for station personnel to forget about their isolation while making friends with other station members.


Not funded by the government or by the military, the money needed to get the choir up to Toronto must be raised on their own accord.

Operation Nunakput, a 10 year success

After 10 years, Operation Nunakput has created great bonds in the north, and those involved can be proud of themselves.

Operation NUNAKPUT 2017, took place in the Northwest Territories and around Great Slave Lake, around Deline, along the Mackenzie River up to Tuktoyaktuk, at Hay River, and on the Nahanni River.

From June 26 to July 20, the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) conducted concurrent and complementary operations with the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP), Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO) and Environment Canada (EC).

These activities tested the effectiveness of the CAF's northern capabilities and promoted the whole-of-government working model outlined in the Canada First Defence Strategy alongside Canada's Northern Strategy.

Using a CC-138 Twin Otter through the 440 Transport (T) Squadron, The RCAF flew 16 operations during this year's operation which included V.I.P transport, working with the fisheries on patrol, and searching for survivors.

"This operation represents Canadian Sovereignty," said Major (Maj.) Steve Thompson with 1 Canadian Air Division. "We've worked closely with other departments and in doing so, created great bonds within the communities." With 440 (T) Squadron, Maj. Thompson says the Twin Otter is an aircraft which can do everything that is needed in the

great north which, search and rescue, paratrooping, and training the Sky-Hawks. When needed, the Twin Otter can also trade out its regular landing gear for skis.

Working together with the communities and the RCMP, Thompson also says the bonds created during the 10 year operation are forever.


"The RCMP was excellent. We worked together well, it was great to see them

be the first to give us a hand, it became a back and forth effort," said Maj. Thompson.

As a result of Operation NUNAKPUT, the North remains secure within a strong and sovereign Canada. The regular presence of the CAF in the western Arctic, has visibly expressed Canadian sovereignty while providing the CAF with eyes and ears in a remote region of this country. Maj. Thompson who has spent a good

majority of his career in the north, says the area also has everything for a small family, including his.

"There are great opportunities up here, and the communities themselves are very family oriented," said Maj. Thompson who hopes he gets to stay for his remainder of his career.


down to the back garden.

Cadets are put through their paces during Commandant Tour

Brigadier General Raymond R. Romses, also a Colonel Commandant of the Royal Canadian Army Cadets, was recently given a tour of the Cadet training facilities at 8 Wing Trenton.

While on his tour he was also brought over to the jump school, at the Canadian Army Advanced Warfare Centre, to be shown the complete facility from top to bottom by Chief Warrant Officer (CWO) Ken Pichie.

"The facility shows a lot of airborne history, and the cadets need to see that to understand where all the training comes from," said Skyler Richardson Master Warrant Officer (MWO) of the Cadets. Cadet MWO Richardson, who completed his basic parachute course the year previous with the cadets, wishes he could once again go through and do it once more. Only 50 cadets are chosen each year for the course, and for this group, they had to show their best as the Commandant watched. "I think it's important for someone who is an Honorary Colonel and who has had a CF career to be given a tour, and it's something for these cadets to see and aspire to," said Captain (Capt.) Diane Allain.

While on tour, two young cadets were


given escort duties and were able to see things up close and personal. Cadets MWO Chouinard and CWO Antao are both in their final year as cadets and are in the process of deciding what is next with their post-secondary lives.

"I am going to go to University first and then decide from there," said Cadet Chouinard. Cadet Antao echoed her friend's sentiments, adding that whether or not she decides to apply as a regular Canadian Air Force (CAF) member, she has learned much from the program.


Commandant Romses who was more than impressed with the tour, said the opportunity the cadets are given is something they can carry throughout their lives.

"It's clearly rigorous training, I'm sure they are finding it challenging but that's why they are here, because they want to be confronted," said the Commandant who admitted that watching the cadets from back fond memories of his own.

"With regards to skills that are transferable in the civilian world, the big thing they learn is regardless of what they do in life, there always going to be challenges," explained Commandant Romses. "Parachuting is not natural, you have to learn how to control your fears and life is like that in many of the things you do".






