CANADA'S 150TH ANNIVERSARY

Camp Rathbun will never be forgotten

One eve in the summer of 1918 / We boarded a steamer in old Napanee / A moonlight excursion to the Castle shore / Where we danced with the boys of the Royal Flying Corp / And the moon paints a ribbon of gold on the bay at Deseronto.

These words were sung by Stephen Medd, during the Flag Raising and Lowering event at Camp Rathbun – Gold Wing Ranch in Deseronto; a day which recognized the 100th Anniversary of the Royal Flying Corp (RFC) and the training base which once stood on the now, Kimmett Family farm.

As a breeze kicked up over the grounds, that familiar wispy static sound came across the speakers one hears at events such as this. It seems to give the moment that extra sense of solemnity. The metal on the flag pole ropes, tap against the poles themselves as the flags flap in the sun calling out to the memories that are no longer lost to history on this farm. "I encourage you to think back to what these skies here would have looked like 100 years ago. You would have heard the sputtering of airplane engines," said Colonel (Col.) Keiver during his address. "They were horribly unreliable and the fact that these young men got into these crates; that were nothing more than cloth and fabric and wood, is amazing when you think about it today."

Like Irene and Vernon we danced on a breeze / As the band played he made me love him with ease / My heart I surrendered that night on the floor / To the dashing cadet of the Royal Flying Corp / And the band played Oh Johnny Oh on the bay at Deseronto.

The day's event took people throughout Deseronto to look at different exhibits held within the city, but more than that, it took them on a trip back to when things were far different in the local area. Young men signing up without their parent's knowledge, uniforms walking the sidewalk and going to church, the skies filled with cadets given roughly five hours of training before being sent off.

A cause close to home for the Keiver family

The 2017 Brain Tumour walk which took place at Zwicks Parks has been deemed a success raising almost \$37,000.

For Colin and Jennifer Keiver, this particular cause hits close to home for their family. In 2012 their 11 year old son William, was diagnosed with a brain tumor.

"It was devastating to hear your child being diagnosed," said Jennifer, wife of Colonel (Colin) Keiver (Col Keiver) Commanding Officer of 8 Wing. "We didn't know what the future held."

Because life never lets you deal with one thing at a time, Colin was also about to be transferred to Ottawa within the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF).

"As a family we had some major decisions to make. The first was William, and the doctors believed that Toronto Sick Kids would be best for him," said Jennifer. "But Colin had to go to Ottawa, and the CAF was so good to us, anything Colin needed they were more than willing to give." So, as William prepared to receive surgery, Colin left his Belleville home for Ottawa and commuted on a regular basis for the next two years to make sure the family unit also stayed strong.

"William's comeback from surgery was amazing. He had the operation in November and by January he was back in school and playing hockey, but at the same time, William said he felt different from the rest of his classmates," something Jennifer said was heartbreaking to hear.

"He was having a tough time and didn't have any other kids he could relate to, to talk with," explained

Jennifer.

As a mother, Jennifer knew she had to do some research and see what was available in the Quinte area to help her son cope emotionally. The Keiver family found that help through the Belleville Brain Tumour Support Group, located at the East Minister United Church on Bridge Street.

Since 2013 the Keiver family has funded and supported the Brain Tumour Walk event in Belleville through sponsoring a team in William's name.

"We are one of the lucky ones," said Jennifer, "Will is five years in the clear, and after the 10 year mark if all goes well, the tumour is less likely to reoccur, and Will won't have to be monitored after much after he turns 18."

Believing in hope, Jennifer knows the Brain Tumour Support Group was a Godsend in helping her family especially William, understanding the situation. Moving forward now as a family, they feel stronger thanks to that support coming into their home.

"If I can offer anything up it's this, if your family is going through an ordeal, find a support group like what we found, you'll find yourself amongst friends who understand and can offer up advice and that support which you or a loved one needs," said Jennifer.

Preparing to once again leave the Quinte region, Jennifer says she is looking forward to the new move as a military spouse back to Ottawa within the CAF, this time, as an entire family.

Major (Maj.) Kirri Lean got a rare opportunity last week to leave the confines of her office and join a CC-177 Globemaster III crew for an operational mission overseas.

The mission was flown in support of Exercise ARCTIC CHALLENGE in northern Finland. The goal of the exercise, which was made up by eleven allied countries, was to demonstrate Air Force inter-operability in the North.

As the Senior Aircraft Maintenance Engineering Officer (SAMEO) at 429 (T) Squadron, it is not often that Maj. Lean gets to experience more than the excited pace of maintenance procedures at Hangar 6. "I wanted to understand the pressures that our technicians face on the road," she explained.

429 Transport Squadron has a unique set-

up when it comes to deployable maintainers. While other airframes send their Flight Engineers, or a single Tech-Crewman, into the field, the C-17's size and complexity demands the attention of two qualified technicians for most missions. They are responsible for a variety of servicing tasks, inspections, and repairs while operating overseas. "It was a great opportunity to see the C-17 in action, and the dedication of the crew that flies with it," said Maj. Lean over the roar of the auxiliary power unit.

The mission was a complete success with a load of cargo being delivered to Rovaniemi, Finland. Maj. Lean didn't have a free ride however; she took part in all the activities that engaged the technicians. Tasks that included topping up engine and hydraulic oil, fault-isolation, and landing gear inspections. "I really learned a lot about the systems on the aircraft, and what it takes to be a tech-crewman," she noted just after



Minister Sajjan Highlights Care for Military Members in Canada's new Defence Policy

8 Wing Trenton was a proud host to Canada's Minister of National Defence June 8th, as Harjit S. Sajjan released the government's new and progressive Defence Policy.

With an increase in military spending between 2017 and 2027 going from \$18.9 billion to \$32.7 billion, this plan will affect young Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) members or those hoping to join in the near future.

A portion of the policy focuses on supporting military families during their move and for areas such as Trenton, it will hopefully be helpful as the rising cost of homes in the Greater Toronto Area is now working its way into the general Quinte Region.

For young members looking to purchase their first home in the Quinte region on a starting salary, or going on the waiting list for a Residential Housing Unit (RHU), that fast-paced house hunting trip from another base to 8 Wing isn't always easy.

Brookfield Global Relocation Services with the CAF, which helps with all aspects of a move from one base to another, has won an-

other contract to continuing serving the military but under a new name, BGRS, and their face to face services will soon be phased out. However, within the new Defence Policy, the Canadian government is promising to develop a comprehensive Military Family Plan to help stabilize family life.

This will include, providing an additional \$6 million per year to modernize Military Family Support Programs such as Military Family Resource Centres (MFRC) to provide better support to families when members are deploying. The policy also includes a mandate to establish relocation expertise to help military families find and access services they need in a new community, and it will work with federal, provincial and private sector partners to improve the co-ordination of services across provinces to ease the burden of moving.

"The women and men who serve are the Canadian Armed Forces' most important capability. By taking care of our people we are building a stronger, more agile military that will be better positioned to protect Canada and its citizens at home and abroad." Sajjan said.



Safety

A common cent doesn't buy very much these days. But common sense is priceless because it provides you with accident-free living every day. This fact is seldom fully appreciated.

A few moments' pause prior to starting any task, large or small, is important. It will allow you to prepare your mind for the job ahead.

One should always consider something called the "worst case scenario" and plan for it. Then if something does happen, your chances of escaping injury are greatly enhanced. This awareness - before the fact - can also serve to reduce or prevent damage to whatever you are working on. Be aware of your surroundings. Know how and where to safely move out of harm's way should something go wrong.

Never allow yourself to be rushed headlong into a job which obviously has a high risk factor, without giving yourself time to consider the possibilities. If you feel that you require a face shield, apron and gloves first, then insist on it. If denied equipment you feel is necessary, talk it over with your supervisor and, if necessary, refuse the work. You could spend the rest of your life maimed if you don't give your well-being your full consideration.

Common sense is the best skill you can practice. Failure to fully appreciate it will one day put you in a no-win situation where you will meet that most severe of teachers - pain.

Common sense goes hand in hand with awareness. Everything going on around you, no matter where you are

or what you are doing is important because it constitutes varying degrees of risk to you. Let's say you are fixing a bike in your driveway and you see that while mowing the lawn, your neighbor's next pass will skirt the edge of his gravel driveway. You should move your project away from danger or take a break until the neighbor has finished mowing. Then, if his mower throws a rock, you have allowed for it and nobody was injured.

Sooner or later, virtually everybody gets a finger caught in a car door. Most of us have stepped on an upturned garden rake. Who among us has never cut themselves while slicing vegetables or peeling fruit? Certain accidents are almost universal and include virtually everybody. The one common aspect of these types of acci-

dents is diminished safety awareness at the time they occur. We get slack from time to time and sooner or later meet pain face to face! Awareness has to be made second nature.

Common sense and awareness are two of the most useful weapons in your arsenal against accidents. They have to be respected for their value and nurtured to maximize their benefits to us all.

Weather watching from the top of the world

The Canadian Forces Station (CFS) Alert Meteorological Centre, also known as the "Met Shack" is located about two kilometres away from the station's main complex, on the northwest side of the runway, halfway down its length. We were shown the facility by Aviator (Avr.) Sean Dobbie.


Avr. Dobbie is a Meteorological Technician (Met Tech) who is attached posted to CFS Alert from his home unit in Gagetown, New Brunswick. He forms a part of a three person team, alongside fellow Met Techs Corporal (Cpl.) Soon Kwon and Team Lead Cpl. Joseph Leclair.

The Met Shack is staffed by three Met Techs who work in a rotation of shifts, with the operational tempo often necessitating late night and early morning hours. They play a critical role in the operation of CFS Alert's airfield by providing meteorological data to pilots prior to their landings and takeoffs. They also generate hourly weather reports which are submitted to the Briefer Workstation, a Trenton-based system used to track all Canadian Forces meteorological and oceanographic data. For each hourly report the Met Techs are responsible for observing the type, amount and opacity of the cloud cover, as well as the overall vis-

ibility. There also is broad array of instrumentation at the Met Shack that measures many variables such as temperature, air pressure and wind speed/direction. On top of their meteorological duties, the Met Techs are also responsible for the operation of the airfield lighting and the air traffic control.

CFS Alert's remote location makes this Met Shack very unique. When storm conditions arise in the winter, the journey back to the station can become too dangerous to attempt, so the Met Shack is equipped to house one Met Tech for extended periods of time. There is a bed and a temporary washroom, as well as a kitchen complete with food and cooking supplies. Due to its proximity to the shoreline relative to the rest of the station, the Met Shack is usually much closer to polar bears when they arrive on station. Just like all other station staff, the Met Techs are trained to stay indoors during these situations to avoid danger.

Despite the isolation, Avr. Dobbie enjoys his job at the Met Shack. His services are essential to the successful operation of the airfield at CFS Alert, and he enjoys being able to make a valuable contribution to the station's team.

Thanks to Bruinsma and Kimmitt family, a piece of RFC history now stands along 126 Deseronto Road. While farmers take to same fields that were once training grounds, and while cars drive down this back road to get to the Bay, these flags at the Gold Wing Ranch will stand tall in the sun, in the breeze and recognize an era, our local generation has been fortunate enough not to deal with on an everyday basis.

Said Col. Keiver when recognizing the hard work of the Bruinsma and Kimmitt family, "Kerry and Nancy, I know you have worked extremely hard, you've put forth a great deal of effort and all I will say is that it is clear to me that you don't have to wear a uniform to put service before self."

Lyme disease

Lyme disease is an infection transmitted through the bite of an infected tick. In Ontario, Lyme disease is only transmitted through the blacklegged tick. The majority of human cases reported occur as a result of exposure to areas known to harbour infected blacklegged ticks. In the early 1990s, there was only one known risk area in Ontario, at Long Point Provincial Park. Since then, Ontario has seen an increase and expansion of black-legged tick populations, particularly in eastern Ontario.

Symptoms of Lyme disease usually begin between three days and one month after being bitten by an infected tick. Prompt antibiotic treatment is usually effective. Early symptoms of Lyme disease may include; fever, headache, muscle and joint pain, fatigue and an expanding red rash.

If left untreated, Lyme disease symptoms could progress to cardiac symptoms such as heart palpitations, arthritic symptoms, extreme fatigue and general weakness, and central and peripheral nervous system disorders. Lyme disease is diagnosed through a combination of symptom presentation, history of exposure to infected ticks and/or validated laboratory test results. The best way to prevent Lyme

disease is to avoid tick bites by using insect repellent when outdoors, wearing proper clothing, removing ticks from the body as soon as possible after bites, and removing tick habitats from around the home.






