2016 Year End Review

Recalling our past – establishing a future worthy of remembrance

2016 was one of those years that will definitely go down in history for 8 Wing/Canadian Forces Base (CFB) Trenton. A year dedicated to remembering their past and the British Commonwealth Air Training Plan (BCATP), the year will especially be remembered for bringing back the Quinte International Air Show (QIAS), an event both the military and civilian communities welcomed back with open arms. The first day of the QIAS saw visitors clog the gates as they tried to get in to this highly anticipated attraction.

Along with the traditional changes of command during the summer, a couple of other new additions to the base were celebrated late in the year. The Integrated Personnel Support Centre was opened by Defence Minister Harjit Sajjan in the fall, bringing worthwhile services and support for 8 Wing members, current and

retired. The Earl of Bessborough Social House opening in November brought huge smiles to the faces of 8 Wing Commander Colonel (Col.) Colin Keiver and television personality Damon Bennett, the two men who conceived the idea of the social house over a beer over one year before.

Finally, very late in the year, it was announced that a Lancaster aircraft from Edmunston, NB would eventually join the Halifax at the National Air Force Museum of Canada (NAFMC) and firmly enhance that museum's unique reputation as well as establish executive director Chris Colton's legacy.

More in tune with the present, 16 new Airbus C295W aircraft were announced to be replacing the venerable C130H model Hercules in the search and rescue role for the RCAF.

So with our history refreshed in our minds throughout the year, we created a year for the history books – a

year when we remembered our past but also established events and facilities that would remind us of this year well into the future.




School Board Prom Project as it began its fifth year of gathering gently-used formal wear and makeup for students who might not otherwise be able to afford to attend their graduations or proms.

The day everyone was waiting for finally arrived – QIAS 2016 tickets went on sale April 1. The family of Master Corporal (MCpl.) Dennis Gorman, a maintainer with Transport/Royal Canadian Electrical and Mechanical Engineers (Tn/RCEME), actually got the first tickets for the QIAS 2016 for a promotional picture for *The Contact* on Wednesday, but as of that Friday morning, everybody else was able to purchase their tickets online or through selected local outlets. Wing Commander Col. Colin Keiver congratulated the Gormans on being the first to actually get their tickets which were literally hot off the presses. It was also an honour for MCpl. Gorman and his family. “It will be one of the last things we do before going back to Newfoundland on medical retirement,” he said shortly after receiving the tickets from Col. Keiver. “But it’s something we absolutely want to do.” Information management is a key element in any mil-

itary organization but it is also often a key weakness, according to Wing Commander Col. Colin Keiver at the leadership forum at the Air Mobility Training Centre auditorium early in April. Col. Keiver noted in his opening remarks at the afternoon sessions that communication helps people work effectively together and that the ability of any military to move information through the system is key so that the right person gets the information at the right time to make a critical right decision. 8 Wing/ CFB Trenton held a Royal Canadian Air Force (RCAF) 92nd anniversary mess dinner at the NAFMC on March 31, 2016, commemorating the efforts made by RCAF personnel during the BCATP. The guests of honour for the evening were a large group of World War II veterans. A historical WW II-era photograph was recreated April 11 at 8 Wing/ CFB Trenton by the Wing’s leadership and QIAS 2016 co-chairs in honour of the

history and heritage that has existed in the region centering on the BCATP. The photograph was taken April 11, 1945 and marked the first of 150 English Oak trees that were transported across the Atlantic Ocean on the RMS Queen Mary to be planted on the Wing along Highway 2. The old photograph shows Group Captain Duncan Bell-Irving, and the Wing’s leadership, watching his granddaughter Virginia and a gardener as they plant the first oak tree. The photograph was found during an archive search as 8 Wing continues its plans to commemorate the BCATP (1939-1945) through a series of events and activities as the QIAS 2016 approaches on June 25-26. The RCAF recently unveiled the CF-18 Demonstration Jet for its 2016 season which was repainted in honour of the history and heritage of the BCATP. The unveiling ceremony took place on April 5, at 4 Wing, Cold Lake, Alberta, where the jet was painted over

the past few weeks. This jet will take part in the QIAS in Trenton on June 25-26. The Trenton MFRC Invisible Ribbon Gala online auction was thriving once again this year after a fantastic introductory year last year. This year’s auction began on April 21, ran for 12 days and concluded on May 2. More than 100 items were to be listed in the auction on Facebook before it ended, online auction coordinator Joanna Cronk estimated. 

Major (Maj.) Richard Morris took over the reins of the 8 Wing Comptroller Branch from highly regarded Maj. Mike Stodart in a Change of Appointment ceremony at the NAFMC. Presiding Officer Col. Colin Keiver noted that the 8 Wing Comptroller Branch was an amazing team lead by an amazing man and doing amazing things with the largest bud-

get in the RCAF. Honorary Colonel (Hon. Col.) Timo Hytonen knew he had huge shoes to fill when he became the new Hon. Col. of 426 Transport Training Squadron but he pledged to do his best with the help of squadron personnel during his investiture ceremony May 26 at the NAFMC.

Repatriated soil from Vimy Ridge containing the symbolic DNA of those soldiers who gave their lives and limbs to take this famous ridge, passed through Trenton early in June. Ultimately destined to be interred at the base of a newly constructed monument at CFB Borden called the Vimy Ridge Legacy Monument and the Barrie cenotaph, the repatriated soil, carried in two urns contained within a small coffin draped with a Canadian flag, stopped for a brief ceremony at the NAFMC on its way to Borden for a ceremony later on June 3. If you were adjacent

to the NAFMC parking lot June 4, you would have had no trouble understanding why they call a large motorcycle procession "rolling thunder." As the approximately 2,200 motorcycles making up the Heroes Highway Ride 2016 departed from that location to begin the annual fundraising and memorial ride; the thunder rolled for nearly an hour to empty the lot.

ExecuTrek is a program which gives civilian business management a first-hand look at training and abilities of military personnel. ExecuTrek came to 8 Wing/ CFB Trenton to demonstrate the impressive training and professional development all CAF members are ex-

posed to on a daily basis. Volunteers were needed at the Trenton MFRC – any age, any skill set in mid-June. Wendy Synnott, volunteer coordinator at the MFRC, Lt.-Col. Cathy Blue, a co-founder of her valuable volunteers every year at this time due to posting season and, while she often gets some back, there is also often a gap between that departure and arrival of the new volunteers.

The QIAS 2016 promised to be a war birds aficionado's dream come true. Visitors to the air show would

see the war birds of World War II as well as the most modern and up-to-date war planes like the F-22 Raptor and everything in between. Lt.-Col. Cathy Blue, a co-chair of QIAS 2016, even indicated at the media day held June 16 that Kent Pietsch would land his airplane on top of a trailer. An 85-year-old relationship was celebrated in late June when the City of Quinte West opened its arms wide and invited 8 Wing/ CFB Trenton to have the Freedom of the City.

QIAS came back in 2016 in a big way in the first edition of July, re-establishing itself in a fashion that set the bar very high for future endeavours. If there is one thing everyone agrees on concerning QIAS 2016, it is that it took a massive team effort to bring it to fruition and once again make it one of the most popular and largest air shows in Canada. Over the two-day event, organizers estimate close to 80,000 spectators teemed through the entrances to watch some of the biggest and baddest aircraft flying today take to the air and open their hatches for static displays in Trenton on two gorgeous days for an air show. Visitors saw the F-22 Raptor put through its paces in the skies over the Bay of Quinte, the B-52 bomber was a big attraction the CF-18 demo team was popular and the ever-popular Snowbirds closed out two days of action that also featured aircraft from the BCATP era.

426 Transport Training Squadron's change of command parade in July was an emotional event for a number of reasons. The incoming Commander Lt.-Col. Brent Hoddinott was taking over the squadron his father commanded 20 years ago on July 12, 1996. Lt.-Col. Ryan Deming, the squadron's outgoing commander had significant life experiences tied to his two tours in the squadron – he married his wife Monica in the first tour and his son Luke was born during this most recent tenure. He was not exaggerating when he said 426 Transport Training Squadron would al-

ways hold a special place in their hearts. It took Lt.-Col. Marie-Claude Gaumond 31 years to finally get a posting with the RCAF, so it was with reluctance she left her position as Commanding Officer of the ATESS, describing it as the "...best posting of my career."

Incoming Wing Operations Officer Lt.-Col. Steve Camps finished his Change of Appointment speech by giving his first order as the new Wing Operations Officer by declaring essential manning for the afternoon and giving his new staff an extra-long weekend prior to rolling up their sleeves and getting back to work on the following Monday, July 11. Lt.-Col. Camps is no stranger to 8 Wing Operations having already done a tour as Deputy Wing Operations Officer, and it was during that period he witnessed first-hand the intense operational tempo they are

subjected to on a regular basis. Engines had barely cooled from QIAS 2016 and the planning was beginning for the next show in 2018. Col. Colin Keiver made it known they are putting things in motion to hold another air show at the end of June 2018. In his announcement, Col. Keiver said the success of QIAS 2016 was truly a team effort.

The town hall meeting held in July by Neil Ellis, Member of Parliament (MP) for the Bay of Quinte riding gave him just what he was looking for – feedback on Canada's defence policy review. Some of the discussion which had been planned for this meeting was postponed when Mr. Ellis announced that in response to issues raised in newspapers that day,

he would be hosting a veteran's town hall meeting in August and Trenton Memorial Hospital issues would be discussed at a meeting on July 26. 8 Wing's 11-person Nijmegen March team joined a number of other teams from across Canada in July as they prepared to depart Trenton for Nijmegen, Netherlands. Having put on well over 600 km in training, the 8 Wing team is ready for Holland.

It was a natural fit in any number of ways. Naming the ATESS refinishing hangar, at CFB Trenton, the "Colonel John Paul Bachlet, CD Refinishing Hangar" was absolutely the right

thing to do. It put a name on the building of a man who wanted nothing less than to command ATESS, and honoured one of their own, a highly respected former Commanding Officer. 424 Transport and Rescue Squadron seems to attract emotional leaders. In these last two Commanding Officers, they have two men who are perhaps emotional opposites – incoming Lt.-Col. Leighton James a very serious and dedicated man, Lt.-Col. Dany Poitras, the outgoing Commanding Officer, much less serious but every bit as dedicated to the squadron, its men and women and its mission.

When they are having fun, they don't mind seeing their normally militarily correct Commanding Officer, Lt.-Col. Kevin Tromp, skateboarding in front of them with the long, blond tresses of a tuned-in surfer. As he prepared to leave the squadron on July 27 after being replaced by Lt.-Col. Leif Dahl, that was how he departed from the squadron and, as with the rest of his tenure, he did it very well and with panache. Two original squadron members – Flying Officers Peter Porter and John Richards – watched the goings-on with pride. The Government of Canada Workplace Charitable Campaign (GCWCC) will be especially important to the United Way of Quinte effort this year, according to executive director Judi Gilbert. "We're essentially a charity that raises money for other charities," she told an advanced organizational meeting of the GCWCC committee.

Col. John Williams. A project now under way at CFB Trenton may prove to be the catalyst for social events transpiring well into the future on the busiest air base in Canada. An all-ranks social house is now being constructed in the old junior ranks Astra Lounge by former television personality Damon Bennett, who is best known for working with Mike Holmes for nearly 10 years on the Holmes Makes it Right, Holmes Inspection, and Holmes on Homes programs. For four years now, Mr. Bennett has been establishing his own business and the Earl of Bessborough Social House is one of the projects he's working on.

Half way through his two-

year tenure, 8 Wing CFB Trenton Commanding Officer Col. Colin Keiver has already had a busy and productive command thanks to the great teamwork from his 8 Wing personnel. While he sees the second year concentrating more on operational efforts, he does have at least one goal to accomplish prior to moving on from 8 Wing. From the outset, Col. Keiver has emphasized the importance of families to 8 Wing and its operational effectiveness and that has not changed as he enters his second year. The Trenton Cadet Training Centre (TCTC) brought genuine history to their Trooping of the Banner at CFB Trenton in August. He won't be returning as the Commanding Officer (CO) of the TCTC next year, but at this stage, he's not sure where he will be. He has been offered a job at the Regional Cadet Support Unit and has applied to several positions, some within the region. But with the renewal within the cadet program

taking place, he is willing to travel to get the position he wants, even to the west coast, where he could satisfy his urge to ski. Sixty-seven of Canada's newest pilots graduated at a Wings Parade at Canadian Forces Detachment (CFD) Mountain View in late August. The parade marked the end of the Glider Pilot Scholarship Course and each of these new pilots was presented with their "wings" after going through the six-week course where the cadets learned to fly a glider but also included navigation skills, meteorology, air law, and airplane handling.

Infrastructure continues to be upgraded at 8 Wing/ CFB Trenton and in early September it was the Integrated Personnel Support Centre (IPSC) which became the most recent new facility at Canada's largest air force base. Defence Minister Harjit Sajjan officially cut the ribbon for the new \$2.4 million IPSC facility, part of a Canada-wide system of support to ill and injured CAF members. Important resources such as return to duty coordination, outreach and advocacy services are available at these centres. Outgoing Commanding Officer Lt.-Col. Troy Paisley called 436 Transport Squadron the "loudest and proudest squadron in the RCAF" at the squadron's change of command parade. He might have added the most active, as well, as he warned incoming Commanding Officer Lt.-Col. Spencer Selhi there would be no dull moments during his two-year tenure.

They were swinging for the greens in 8 Wing's GC-WCC in 2016. Kicking off the campaign in early September, Wing Commander Col. Colin Keiver launched the ball off the tee to begin the tournament used by co-campaign chairs Maj. Christopher Hepburn and Master Warrant Officer (MWO) Scott Creamer to support the United Way of Quinte campaign along with Executive Director Judi Gilbert. The enduring legacy of 8 Wing/ CFB Trenton is now well documented in the 8 Wing Heritage Park, officially opened in September by Wing Commander Col. Colin Keiver. This spectacular new park in front of the Officers' Mess replaces an eyesore Col. Keiver referred to in his opening remarks as "a pit of despair," a former sunken garden ravaged by

time and neglect. In his second leadership retreat, Wing Commander Col. Colin Keiver made it plain that communication had a huge impact on his first year in command and he wants to see that continue through the second year. Wing-wide communication was responsible for re-establishing the QIAS in a very short period of time and Col. Keiver said he was very proud of the teamwork demonstrated to make that happen. Having said all of that, he noted that it is area where, in general, 8 Wing must improve. A full-service MFRC facility will open at 610 Dundas St., East, in Belleville prior to Christmas, according to Trenton MFRC executive Director Tamara Kleinschmidt. While much of the talk to this point has involved daycare at the new facility, she is quick to point out the Belleville MFRC office will be a resource centre that will include programming associated with deployment separation, counselling, whatever variety of workshops ultimately get established plus child care.

A CC-130J Hercules aircraft departed 8 Wing/CFB Trenton on a tasked mission of moving cargo and passengers to a base in central Australia in support of the multinational Electronic Warfare (EW) trial DESERT RIDER on Aug. 25. Initially planning to participate in the trial, the Hercules crew and EW experts from Transport and Rescue Standards and Evaluation Team (TRSET), Transport Operational Test and Evaluation Flight (TOTEF) and 426 Transport Training Squadron crew were to remain in Australia for the duration of the trial.

Wounded Warriors Canada kicked off their inaugural Highway of Heroes Bike Ride in late September with approximately 150 cyclists riding from the ARM in Bain Park to the Ontario Veterans War Memorial in Queen's Park, Toronto, with the goal of raising \$200,000 for the charity. CAF Provost Marshall Brigadier-General (Brig.-Gen.) Robert Delaney officially announced the establishment of a new 18-member team dedicated to supporting the investigation of criminal sexual offences within the CAF and the Department of National Defence (DND) in Trenton at the end of September.







A cairn commemorated on Oct. 30 at the NAFMC is meant to remind us all of the tragic events and acts of heroism which occurred on Oct. 30, 1991. On that day, a CC-130 Hercules conducting a semi-annual resupply mission to CFS Alert with 18 people on board lost radar and communication with CFS Alert. The Hercules crashed into a rocky cliff

16 km south of Alert, sparking the largest air and ground rescue operation ever undertaken by the Canadian military in the north. Lt.-Col. Mike Thornley, Deputy Commander of the Joint Personnel Support Unit (JPSU) of Ottawa, told those gathered for the official grand opening of the Integrated Personnel Support Centre (ISPC) in Trenton in November the new facility would help base leadership maintain a chain of concern for their ill and injured personnel.

Just over a year removed from its inception, The Earl of Bessborough Social House at 8 Wing/ CFB Trenton was now ready for its grand opening. Described as a meeting place for all members of the 8 Wing community by Wing Commander Col. Colin Keiver, this newest facility at CFB Trenton was being admired by all who saw it, so far, including Col. Keiver.

It started over a pint of beer and it ended over a pint of beer. In the beginning, Wing Commander Col. Colin Keiver and television personality Damon Bennett were just talking while enjoying a brew. A year later, they were preparing to enjoy a brew at the Earl of Bessborough Social House, a place where men and women of all ranks

CAFwho have travelled to foreign lands to fight for the freedom of others. Trenton Legion President Manny Raspberry noted generations of heroes had populated wars from the Great War to Afghanistan. "This is a moment to honour their memory and strengthen our resolve as a nation and individuals to live up to the ideals that they fought and died for," he stated.

Logistics Officer Maj. Scott Foote's remains were repatriated Nov. 20 after Maj. Foote died while serving his country abroad. Maj. Foote had been serving in Amman, Jordan and died from circumstances not directly related to military operations. The flag-draped remains of Maj. Foote were carried from a CAF CC-117 Globemaster III at the passenger terminal of CFB Trenton Sunday afternoon with his family, friends and colleagues looking on in gloomy, blustery weather. Maj. Foote, 50, was found unconscious in a military gym and was later pronounced dead after efforts to revive him failed. Chris Colton's legacy as the Executive Director of the NAFMC is now well established. And with the addition of the Lancaster KB 882, which will soon be transferred from Edmunston, NB, to the NAFMC in Trenton, the Museum will link it up with the Halifax it flew missions with at the closing of World War II. When these two aircraft go on display in 2024, no other museum in the world will have fully restored Halifax and Lancaster bombers on display.




