Globemaster locks in over 10,000 flying hours

After 11 years in service at 8 Wing Trenton the CC-177 Globemaster III has reached an impressive milestone. First delivered to the base in August 2007, the first of five long-range transport aircraft, '701' has since logged in more

than 10,000 flying hours. To celebrate the achievement, a small ceremony was held at 8 Wing Trenton on Oct. 17. In attendance were members of 429 Transport Squadron, who maintain and operate the Globemaster daily and Brigadier-General Iain Huddleston, Deputy Commander Force Generation at 1 Canadian Air Division (1 CAD).



CAF assists in humanitarian aid in Indonesia

Late in the afternoon of Sunday, October 7, Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) members from 2 Wing Bagotville and 8 Wing Trenton received the call that they were deploying early the next morning to Indonesia to aid in disaster relief efforts in the wake of a massive 7.5 magnitude earthquake. The deployment was part of Operation RENAISSANCE, the Canadian

Armed Forces support for humanitarian relief efforts. As a result of the earthquake, the city of Palu on the island of Sulawesi was struck with a tsunami that devastated the region, leaving 2000 dead, 5000 missing, and damage to infrastructure in the region. Five days later, in the evening of October 12, our team arrived in Balikpapan, Indonesia, the hub of the international humanitarian aid response. The CC-130J aircrew was pressed into service to deliver their first shipment of humanitarian aid which had accompanied

the 20 strong Air Task Force (ATF) from Canada. The multinational task force includes 11 Hercules aircraft from Australia, Japan, Philippines, Singapore, South Korea, and the United States. It is tasked with the distribution of aid pouring into Indonesia. Every day at 1700 hours (5 p.m.), the Canadian ATF Commander, Major Eric Duquette, meets with his multinational counterparts at the Indonesian Operations Centre. At this meeting, the "Air Angels" schedule launch times, and loads are solidified for the following day.

Positive connections with our partner nations have been the key to our success to date. Each day, while the aircrew prepare the aircraft for departure, support staff prepares the supplies to be loaded on aircraft. Regardless of trade, occupation or nationality, every member of the task force contributes to the effort. Borders disappear, as it is not a Canadian pallet or a Japanese pallet they are preparing, but aid for those in need.

Halloween Safety Tips

With witches, goblins, and super-heroes descending on neighbourhoods across Canada, we offer parents some safety tips to help prepare their children for a safe and enjoyable trick-or-treat holiday. Halloween should be filled with surprise and enjoyment, and following some common sense practices can keep events safer and more fun!

- Costumes should be light-coloured and flame resistant with reflective strips so that children are more easily seen at night. (And remember to put reflective tape on bikes, skateboards, and brooms, too!)
- Costumes should be short enough to avoid tripping.
- Remind children to keep away from open fires and candles. (Costumes can be extremely flammable.)
- Use face paint rather than masks or things that will cover the eyes.
- Remind children to walk, slither, and sneak on sidewalks - not in the street.
- Explain to children that calls should be made along one side of the street first and then the other, and that it's best to cross the street only at intersections or crosswalks.
- Remind children to look both ways before crossing the street to check for cars, trucks, and low-flying brooms.
- Provide yourself or the children with a flashlight to see well and to be better seen.
- Have children plan their route and share it with you and the family.
- Trick or Treaters should travel in groups of four or five. An adult should accompany young children.
- Visit homes that have the porch light on.
- Make sure children know they should accept treats at the door and must not get into cars or enter the homes or apartments of strangers.
- Remind children not to eat their treats and goodies until an adult at home examines them.
- Candy should not be eaten if the package is already opened. Small, hard pieces of candy are a choking hazard for young children.
- Make sure you and your children know where the Block Parent houses are located in the neighborhood.
- Set agreed-to boundaries with your children. Explain the importance of staying within them and arriving home on time.

A group of Latin-American Canadian officers and non-commissioned members from the

S-218 has been approved at the federal level in both Parliament and the Senate. Therefore, every October there will now be an official celebration of the Latin-American Heritage month in Canada. The event had speeches explaining the importance of celebrating the Latin-American heritage and the presence of some senators, members of parliament and the Minister of Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship. Also, there were folk dances from local Latin-American dance groups and local, authentic Latin-American cuisine. In attendance was Captain (Capt.) Rey Garcia-Salas and Capt. Milton Hoyos, who began organizing CAF Latin-American activities some eight years ago. Also present were Capt. Grisaura Gutierrez, and Sergio Rodriguez, the National Capital Region-Defence Visible Minorities Advisory Group civilian co-chairs. These four members promote activities at DND/CAF such as the CAF Latin-American Christmas Dinner, participation in the Festival Latino Parades, and the Encuentro Internacional Latino Gala Dinner in the National Capital Region. Canada is a multicultural country, therefore, this celebration will reflect the wider community

of our nation. It will also provide the opportunity for the senior officers, managers and colleagues to learn more about Latin-American Canadian culture and interact with other members of the Defence Team, in harmony with Strong, Secure, and Engaged and its commitment to recruitment, training and retention, leveraging Canada's diversity, inclusion, and promoting a culture of leadership, respect and honour. One of the planned activities includes a DND/CAF Military Latin-American History Exhibition. This activity will provide a graphic exposure of the Latin American community contribution to the CAF in Canada and overseas. The importance of this exhibition is to share stories of Latin-Canadians in war-zones or on peacekeeping missions. Other activities include a distinguished Latin-Canadians guest speaker series, which will include a panel of Latin American Canadians who contribute to Canada in different areas such as medicine, military and defence, academic, scientific, politics, etc.





Ask a Dentist ? Bad Breath





First to take to the podium to share his thoughts on the milestone was 429 Transport Squadron's commanding officer Lieutenant-Colonel (Lt.-Col.) Bryce Graham. "This is a very special moment for the squadron and the strategic airlift capability at large," he said. "I'm extremely proud of all the women and men, past and present, of 429 'Bison' Squadron for their hard work and dedication to operational excellence. The CC-177 remains a highly capable platform in supporting the various operational requirements, domestically and abroad for the Government of Canada and Canadians." Pointing to the towering aircraft behind him, Lt.-Col. Graham shared that he had felt honoured to be flying inside the CC-177 when it reached the 10,000 flying hour mark during a recent resupply mission up north. He went on to share that the RCAF has operated the aircraft over the years from missions in Afghanistan to humanitarian aid in places like Haiti, the Himalayas and Puerto Rico. "Whenever I have the chance to speak with our American allies, they are in awe with the tremendous support that we are able to provide with such a limited amount of resources," explained Lt.-Col. Graham. "Ten thousand hours on this airplane speaks to the tremendous accomplishments and support that this squadron and capability have been able to provide over the years." Also sharing a few words was Brig.-Gen. Huddleston, who served as the commanding officer of 429 Transport Squadron from 2009-2011. He too shared his appreciation for the CC-177 and its ability to transform the RCAF at an operational level. "The CC-177 is without equal," he said. "You impress us at 1 CAD every day with your efforts and ability to keep those five airplanes working for the Canadian Forces." Following the ceremony, he added it had been great to be a part of the ceremony and pay his tributes to both the aircraft and the

squadron members. When asked what his thoughts were on the aircraft, he noted it was one of his favourites. "What an airplane," he said while marveling at the grey giant. As for one of his proudest memories serving on the CC-177, Brig.-Gen. Huddleston shared it had been when it was deployed to Haiti for humanitarian aid in the wake of the earthquake in 2010. "The mission is fulfilling and you really get a lot out of doing what the airplane does in terms of supporting people around the world," he said. At 3 p.m. on August 23, 2007, the first CC-177 delivered to the RCAF left Trenton on its first operational mission to Jamaica. It was carrying 32 tonnes of humanitarian aid from the Canadian Red Cross and the Canadian International Development Agency, which in the past would have required four CC-130 Hercules flights. The CC-177 arrived back in Trenton around 3 a.m. the following day.

From October 16-19, Chief Warrant Officer Denis Gaudreault, Royal Canadian Air Force Chief Warrant Officer (RCAF CWO) hosted senior appointed CWOs from across the RCAF at 8 Wing Trenton during a symposium. The meeting was an opportunity to exchange information between the RCAF's senior appointed CWOs (non-commissioned members) and work on issues which are of importance to RCAF members, including operational dress, RCAF succession planning, and various new and emerging CAF policies, including those concerning beards and the legalization of cannabis. While in Trenton, the symposium participants toured 8 Wing and lodger units including 426 (Transport) Training Squadron, Aerospace and Telecommunications Engineering Support Squadron (ATESS) and the Royal Canadian Air Force Aerospace Warfare Centre. They also visited the National Air Force Museum of Canada. In addition, the chiefs conducted a town hall with 8 Wing non-commissioned members and took part in Canadian Armed Forces Sports Day. Speaking to how well he felt the symposium had gone was 8 Wing Chief Warrant Officer Troy Zuorro. "This is a great group of folks who are super leaders," he said of his colleagues. "The symposium is very, very important and it helps connect everybody with exactly what's going on at the tactical level. It also gives us as wing chiefs the opportunity to see things we may not necessarily be familiar with on other wings." He added that the week was also a time to ensure that he and his peers were in alignment with the vision set out by the RCAF commander to ensure

they "move together as one big team." This was a great opportunity for folks to ask questions about things they weren't clear about and get it straight from the top." As for his thoughts on what makes an individual a good chief warrant officer, he said being genuine was critical. "It's easy for folks to be intimidated by rank, so approachability is an important thing," he explained. "A big part of that is making sure you are honest and open. Folks need to feel comfortable letting you know what they're really thinking." CWO Colcy added that he couldn't have asked for better colleagues and that the men and women of 8 Wing Trenton were in especially good hands. "Troy Zuorro is a superb chief warrant officer and is respected by his peers greatly for that," he said. "He is exactly what you see. He genuinely cares deeply about his people and has that capacity to protect the institution at the same time."

CWO Zuorro went onto add that over the years, the role of a chief warrant officer has shifted. While they are still tasked with being a disciplinarian, their role as advisers has evolved. "One of our main responsibilities is to advise and be there for our commanders and keep our finger on the pulse," he shared. "In order to do that and truly know the issues at the tactical level, we have to be approachable. We certainly put ourselves out there on the wing, speak with folks and encourage as often as possible, for people to come speak to us at any time." Also reflecting on the symposium was 19 Wing Comox's Wing Chief Warrant Officer (CWO) Kevin Colcy. He too noted that the week had been a great opportunity to reconnect with his peers and learn more about how 8 Wing Trenton operates. CWO Colcy added one of the highlights of the symposium had been the town hall meeting. "It was good to see the turnout and it was good to see people asking questions across a variety of topics," he said. "It shows people are engaged."
