8 Wing Trenton's Air Traffic Controllers (ATC) are once again aiming to make a difference in the lives of those affected by cancer.

Now in its 18th year, the annual Controllers Against Cancer hockey tournament has raised more than \$85,000 since its inception for the local branches of the Canadian Cancer Soci-

ety (CCS).

Teams comprised of air traffic controllers from 8 Wing Trenton, North Bay, Bagotville and even New York could be found scrapping it out on the ice.

This year was nothing short of a success. A grand total of over \$12,000 was raised at the fundraiser, which was held at the RCAF Flyers Arena from April 13-15.

Captain (Capt.) Kelly Heath, chief controller of 8 Wing Trenton's tower, noted she couldn't have been happier to be involved in the planning of the event and was thankful for everyone's contributions.

"We really rely heavily on the support of the local area to make this event a success," she said, adding that businesses like Belleville's Shoeless Joe Sports Bar and Grill

were instrumental in this year's kickoff event. "They were generous enough to provide 10 per cent of their sales for an entire day, so in total we raised almost \$1,300 there."

She also attributed to the success of the tournament to their gold sponsors, Bank of Montreal and Falcon Environmental Services.

'Thunderbirds' welcome Loyalist College president as honorary colonel

A squadron responsible for training some of the Royal Canadian Air Force's very best has welcomed Loyalist College president Dr. Anne Marie Vaughan to their team.

In a special ceremony held at 8 Wing Trenton, members of 426 (Transport) Training Squadron officially recognized the local educator as their honorary colonel on April 11.

Some of 426 Transport Training Squadron's responsibilities include training and preparing aircrew, technicians and aeromedical personnel working aboard the RCAF's CC-130 Hercules and CC-150 Polaris.

While serving with the 'Thunderbirds', Honorary Colonel (HCol) Vaughan will be responsible for offering mentorship to the commanding officer and squadron members, as well as helping to build relationships between other units and the community.

During her speech, she proudly shared her family's military experience during the First World War and onward, as well as the legacy they left.

"This opportunity to serve as honorary colonel, to get to know a new generation of women and men who serve our country is very special to me," she said. "I am deeply honoured to be connected to the train-

ing unit as I learn about the preparation of our Air Force personnel."

In her final remarks, HCol Vaughan noted she was excited to get to meet more members of the squadron and work alongside them in the future. "I am passionate about learning and inspired by service," she said. "I look forward to learning more from you."

Also taking to the podium to officially welcome HCol Vaughan was the squadron's commanding officer Lieutenant-Colonel (Lt.-Col.) Brent Hoddinott.

Sharing that his squadron was now in its 75th year of service, he explained why HCol Vaughan was a "perfect match" for the team.

"You have a reputation for putting student success first," he said. "It goes without saying that you will bring so much to 426 Squadron. I'm very excited for what the future holds."

He then went on to share his pride for his squadron while assuring HCol. Vaughan she would feel right at home.

"In the 21 months that I have been the commanding officer, the Thunderbirds have truly astonished me," Lt.-Col. Hoddinott said. "I've been gobsmacked about the work and dedication that they have done for continuous improvement. It's truly inspiring."

HCol. Vaughan will serve in the honorary colonel position over the next three years.

Le Jour de deuil national, célébré chaque année au Canada le 28 avril, rend hommage aux personnes qui sont mortes ou qui ont été blessées, ou qui sont devenues malades en milieu de travail ou par suite d'une tragédie en milieu de travail.

Statistiques et plus

Les plus récentes statistiques de l'Association des commissions des accidents du travail du Canada (ACATC) indiquent qu'en 2016, on a recensé 905 décès en milieu de travail au Canada. Parmi les personnes décédées, 6 travailleurs étaient âgés entre 15-19, et 20 travailleurs avaient entre 20-24.

En plus de ces décès, 241 508 demandes ont été acceptées pour des heures de travail perdues en raison d'un accident de travail ou d'une maladie professionnelle, y compris 29 588 demandes de jeunes travailleurs qui étaient âgés entre 15-24, et ces statistiques indiquent uniquement les accidents déclarés et acceptés par les commissions des accidents du travail. Il va sans dire que le nombre total de travailleurs touchés est encore plus élevé. Ces chiffres n'indiquent pas, toutefois, combien de personnes ont été touchées directement par ces tragédies en milieu de travail. Le décès d'un travailleur a une incidence négative sur les proches, la famille, les amis et les collègues, ce qui change leur vie pour toujours.

Commémoration

Le Jour de deuil national n'est pas seulement un jour pour rendre hommage aux personnes qui sont mortes ou qui ont été blessées par suite d'une tragédie en milieu de travail, mais est aussi un jour pour

renouveler l'engagement à améliorer la santé et la sécurité en milieu de travail et à prévenir les blessures, les maladies et les décès.

Le 28 avril, le drapeau canadien sera hissé à mi-mât sur la colline du Parlement et sur tous les immeubles du gouvernement fédéral. Les employeurs et les travailleurs commémoreront le Jour de deuil de plusieurs façons. Ils peuvent allumer des bougies, déposer des couronnes ou porter une épingle commémorative, un ruban ou un brassard noir, et observent un moment de silence à 11 h.

Historique

En 1991, huit ans après l'adoption du Jour de deuil par le Congrès du travail du Canada, le Parlement du Canada a promulgué la Loi sur le jour de compassion pour les travailleurs qui énonce que le 28 avril est un jour de deuil officiel. Aujourd'hui, le Jour de deuil est commémoré dans environ 100 pays partout au monde et est reconnu comme le jour de compassion pour les travailleurs et le jour international de compassion pour les travailleurs par l'Organisation internationale du travail (OIT) et la Confédération syndicale internationale (CSI).

Le CCHST espère que la commémoration annuelle de cette journée sensibilisera davantage à l'importance d'établir des conditions de travail sécuritaires pour prévenir les blessures et les décès. Il s'agit de la journée choisie pour rendre hommage aux travailleurs décédés, mais elle est aussi un vibrant appel en vue de protéger les vivants et de faire du milieu de travail en endroit où s'épanouir.

The National Day of Mourning, held annually in Canada on April 28, is dedicated to remembering those who have lost their lives, or suffered injury or illness on the job or due to a work-related tragedy.

Statistics and beyond

The most recent statistics from the Association of Workers' Compensation Boards of Canada (AWCBC) tell us that in 2015, 852 workplace deaths were recorded in Canada. Among those dead were four young workers aged fifteen to nineteen years; and another eleven workers aged twenty to twenty-four years. Add to these fatalities the 232,629 claims accepted for lost time due to a work-related injury or disease, including 8,155 from young workers aged fifteen to nineteen, and the fact that these statistics only include what is reported and accepted by the compensation boards, and it is safe to say that the total number of workers impacted is even higher. What these numbers don't show is just how many people are directly affected by these workplace tragedies. Each worker death impacts the loved ones, families, friends and co-workers they leave behind, changing all of their lives forever.

Observance

The National Day of Mourning is not only a day to remember and honour those lives lost or injured due to a workplace tragedy, but also a day to renew the commitment to improve

health and safety in the workplace and prevent further injuries, illnesses and deaths.

On April 28th the Canadian flag will fly at half-mast on Parliament Hill and on all federal government buildings. Employers and workers will observe Day of Mourning in a variety of ways. Some light candles, lay wreaths, wear commemorative pins, ribbons or black armbands, and pause for a moment of silence at 11:00 a.m.

History

In 1991, eight years after the day of remembrance was launched by the Canadian Labour Congress, the Parliament of Canada passed the Workers Mourning Day Act making April 28 an official Day of Mourning. Today the Day of Mourning has since spread to about 100 countries around the world and is recognized as Workers' Memorial Day, and as International Workers' Memorial Day by the International Labour Organisation (ILO) and the International Trade Union Confederation (ITUC).

It is the hope of CCOHS that the annual observance of this day will help strengthen the resolve to establish safe and healthy conditions in the workplace, and prevent further injuries and deaths. As much as this is a day to remember the dead, it is also a call to protect the living and make work a place to thrive.

Members of 8 Wing Trenton are one of many groups across Canada showing their support for the Humboldt Broncos.

Donning their favourite jerseys, hundreds gathered at the RCAF Flyers Arena for a one-of-a-kind photo on April 12.

Tragedy struck for the Saskatchewan Junior League Hockey team, who were on their way to Nipawin, when a collision with a semi-trailer claimed the lives of 16 people and injured several more on April 6.

As a result, millions across Canada have since been showing their support to the families of those affected through donations, memorials and tributes.

The initiative known as #jerseysforhumboldt was first suggested on social media platforms by a group of concerned hockey parents in British Columbia.

In true community spirit, millions across Canada ran with the idea and showed up to work and schools in their hockey jerseys on April 12 in support of the town of Humboldt and the victims of the crash.

As for how 8 Wing Trenton's involvement in the initiative came about, Wing Chief Warrant Officer (WCWO) Troy Zuorro said the idea to participate had come from Blain Lapierre, a civilian employee working for 8 Mission Support Squadron. Other members of 8 Wing including 412 Squadron in Ottawa, 436 Squadron and

Canadian Forces Station Alert also took part.

"This is a way for us to show our support the Humboldt Broncos and everyone that's been affected by this tragedy," said WCWO Zuorro.

He went on to add that it was especially important to show respect since many military members, like those at 8 Wing Trenton, live in small hockey communities across the country.

"Hockey is a big part of Canadian tradition," he explained, "The (military) is just a big team integrated into these communities and of course a tragedy of this gravity affects all of us."

Also standing with the military community in honour of the Humboldt Broncos at the tribute was Quinte West's Mayor Jim Harrison and his wife Jane Harrison.

Both donning Trenton Golden Hawks jerseys, the local Ontario Junior Hockey League team, they too noted the importance of showing their support for fellow hockey communities.

"We're all very stressed by this tragedy and want to show our support," said Mayor Harrison. "It was really great for the base to do this. We're a great municipality because of the people here."

He added that he was initially "devastated" by the news of the Humboldt Broncos crash and couldn't help but think of the safety of his city's own young hockey players.

The last 25 years of 8 Air Maintenance Squadron's (8 AMS) existence has been nothing short of a success says commanding officer Lieutenant-Colonel (Lt-Col.) Todd Murphy. In celebration of the milestone achievement, he along with several members of 8 Wing Trenton gathered for a special ceremony on April 13.

8 AMS provides second-line maintenance at 8 Wing for aircraft including the CC-130H and CC-130J Hercules and CC-177 Globemaster. "It's the people of this organization that make it great," said Lt-Col Murphy, while addressing the audience, "from our previous members to the current serving members, our legacy will live on and this organization will continue to deliver RCAF operations moving forward."

Reflecting on the squadron's motto, which translates to "with combined powers," Lt-Col Murphy reiterated that their years of success would not have been possible without everyone's ability to work together as a team. "At the end of the day we have a supporting relationship to the flying squadrons at this wing," he said, "but we are also supported in numerous ways that allow us to deliver that (capability)." As for the future of the squadron, he noted they have many more contributions to make and said he hoped they would do so with "pride and professionalism."

Also helping to celebrate the squadron's accomplishments and to preside over the ceremony was Colonel (Col.) Luc Sabourin, the director of A4 Maintenance at 1 Canadian Air Division. In his role, he oversees all maintenance operations being conducted in the Royal Canadian Air Force (RCAF). From 2002-2011, 8 AMS had deployed close to 600 personnel for a combined number of more than 100,000 days supporting various missions. Some of the missions they have been involved in, both domestically and abroad, have included Operation Lentus, Operation Impact and Operation Renaissance.

In addition, a raffle and silent auction were also held to help boost the overall amount raised for the Canadian Cancer Society.

The annual fundraiser is especially important to Capt. Heath who noted several members of her family have been affected by cancer.

"My grandmother herself has had cancer, my father-in-law has had skin cancer and I've had two cousins that have

fought lymphoma," she said. "I think that's why I get so passionate about the event because it makes you work harder when you know you have someone who has (been impacted by cancer) that you can relate to."

All proceeds raised from the tournament will stay local and will specifically be used to support the organization's Wheels of Hope program, said Canadian Cancer Society community fundraising specialist Jessica Klein

She went onto note the importance of aiding programs like Wheels of Hope

and the benefit it has on families in need. "It's a huge program in this area," she explained, "especially in rural areas where it is actually a lifeline for people. (Wheels of Hope) serves those that are most marginalized and they really are the people who simply would not be able to get to their treatments without it."

The Wheels of Hope program has been existence since at least 2005 and in the last year, on average, 2,000 rides were given to patients in need within this region.

As for the Canadian Cancer Society's relationship with the base, Klein said it couldn't have been a better fit and was another great way to bring awareness to a disease that affects so many.



Kingston to their roster. While his military basketball career and time posted in Trenton is beginning to come to a close, Lt.-Col. Murphy said he was honoured to be a part of the Trenton team and would always cherish the memories. "There's a sense of pride wearing the 8 Wing uniform," he said. "This is a nice way to leave Trenton for sure and leaving here as defending national champs is certainly something I'll take pride in for the rest of my career." As for his final thoughts, Lt.-Col. Murphy noted that the team's win would

not have been possible without the support from the base's various chain of command teams who allowed the players time off from work to compete, as well as the Personnel Support Program (PSP) staff that help facilitate team sports throughout the year. "It truly is a collective effort and the entire wing should celebrate in this with us," he said.
