Deseronto ceremony commemorates 100th anniversary of the Royal Air Force

Honouring the fallen has proven to be a time-honoured tradition that the community of 8 Wing Trenton is proud to be a part of – especially as this year marks the

100th anniversary of the Royal Air Force (RAF) and the end of the First World War.

Like in years previous, a large crowd gathered at the Deseronto Cemetery, located on the outskirts of Greater Napanee, for an annual commemora-

tion ceremony on June 9. The event was hosted by 418 Wing (Belleville) Royal Canadian Air Force Association and was complete with a band, a colour party and members from 8 Wing Trenton.

Those in attendance took the

time to re-ect speci-ally on the members of the Royal Flying Corps (RFC) and the RAF who lost their lives while stationed at Canadian training sites, Camp Rathburn and Camp Mohawk, from 1917-1919.

On June 9, CFS ALERT members were proud to unveil the newest addition to the station: A collaborative mural dedicated to honouring Inuit culture. The mural, which is situated in the station's Internet Café, is one of several examples of Station artwork, which highlights an appreciation for Inuit culture. The new Internet Café was recently named the Qumaq Café after Taamusi Qumaq, an Inuit activist for preservation of language and culture and a recipient of the Order of Canada in 1993. A second mural with a similar theme is planned for the opposite wall of

the room. Images depicted in the mural include an igloo, Crystal Mountain, a polar bear, an inukshuk, and a thunderbird. The design of the mural was conceived by Kathleen Burke, one of the Nasittuq civilian staff, and took approximately five days to complete. Several other Station members contributed with their painting skills including Master Warrant Officer R. Hansen, Corporal J. Lapid, Lieutenant. H. Buttici, Petty Officer Second Class A. Bradbury, Master Corporal. Neave, and George Finney.

The RAF, which was first formed on April 1, 1918, was the result of the amalgamation of the Royal Naval Service and the Royal Flying Corps. To this day, history has shown that since its birth, England's aerial warfare force has maintained a long and lasting relationship with partners like the Royal Canadian Air Force. At this year's ceremony, the life of RAF member Lieutenant (Lt.) Colin Coleridge was highlighted and his acts of bravery showcased.

Originally from the small village of Snettisham, England, Lt. Coleridge immigrated to Canada in 1911 and served as a member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police and eventually joined as a member of the Royal Flying Corps.

During his time at Camp Mohawk, Lt. Coleridge would receive the first Member of the British Empire honour for bravery. Those at the ceremony were also told the story of his efforts to save a cadet from a burning aircraft, despite the risk to his own life and the following injuries he faced.

Notwithstanding a willingness to serve, the young lieutenant's life was short-lived and he was killed in a plane crash in July 1918 while at Camp Mohawk. Buried with full military honours, Lt. Coleridge's was laid to rest in the quiet and scenic cemetery of Deseronto.

In attendance to pay their respects to the fallen members and Lt. Coleridge were local dignitaries, a representative from the Royal Canadian Mounted Police and officials from the village of Snettisham, England.

Taking the time to share a few words with the crowd was Deseronto's mayor Norm Clark.

"It is an honour for me to be here today,

as I have been for the last several years, to celebrate the lives of the young men and women who gave their lives so we could have freedom in our country," he said.

The mayor went on to note that more than 40 men associated with the local training camps had been killed in flying accidents, while another 10 succumb to illnesses like the Spanish flu.

While Camp Rathburn and Camp Mohawk had only been open for 19 months, their lasting impact on the community would last a lifetime, added Clark.

"I just thank God that we live in Canada and that we have the military that we have protecting us in Canada, but also around the world," he said. "Today is not only a thank you to the men and women of the past, but also the men and women who are serving today."

Also sharing a few words was 8 Wing Commander Colonel (Col.) Mark Goulden, who reiterated Mayor Norm in his appreciation for the men and women who sacrificed their lives in support of the First World War.

He went on to explain that learning to fly had been a dangerous business and out of the 14,000 Royal Flying Corps and Royal Air Force men who died in the First World War, 8,000 were killed while training.

"We vow to never forget and to save those who died from anonymity," he said. "Today we honour those who served here and paid the ultimate sacrifice to secure the freedoms that we enjoy as Canadians."

Members of 608 Duke of Edinburgh Royal Canadian Air Cadet Squadron and 704 Air Force City Royal Canadian Air Cadet Squadron were also on hand to pay their respects and partake in the ceremony as members of the live band and the ceremonial colour party.

Safety



Read and Heed Chemical Information

The more you learn about the chemicals you work with, the better your chances of preventing an accident and protecting yourself. Pay attention to your workplace training programs on chemical safety, and read the labels and Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS).

Follow this checklist for chemical safety:

- **Obtain training for the chemicals in your work area.**
Do not handle chemicals unless you are trained and authorized to do so.
- **Read the labels on chemical containers.**
These will provide important information on the hazards and how to avoid exposure. Labels will also tell you what to do in an emergency. A label will tell you if the chemical can cause injury or death, whether it is a fire or health hazard and whether it reacts violently to other substances.
- **Read the Material Safety Data Sheets for workplace chemicals.** This information sheet will give you in-depth information about the hazards and how to protect yourself. Follow the manufacturer's instructions and your workplace training for chemicals.
- **Wear the right Personal Protective Equipment (PPE).** Depending on the chemical involved, this could include safety goggles, head protection, rubber or vinyl gloves, an apron, safety footwear and respiratory protection. You need expert help in choosing and fitting protective equipment. It should be made of certain materials to match certain chemical hazards. Respirators must be chosen for a particular hazard and fitted so they can protect you adequately. Maintain this protective gear so it can continue to protect you. Check for rips in fabric and damaged fasteners. Make sure the equipment is in good shape before each wearing.
- **Learn the procedures for removing and disposing of contaminated clothing.**
- **Close chemical containers when not in use.**
Make sure all containers are labeled.
- **Store chemicals according to the manufacturer's instructions.**
Maintain adequate ventilation. Keep them away from all sources of ignition. Keep incompatible materials away from each other. Know what to do in case of an emergency. Know what emergency numbers to call, where to locate the MSDS and how to evacuate the area. Learn how to clean up spills and fight small fires — if you are authorized to do so. Familiarize yourself with safety showers and eyewashes in case of chemical exposure.



- **Keep beverages, food and cigarettes out of the work area.**
Wash before eating, drinking, smoking or using the toilet.
- **Never take chemicals for granted.**
They can cause immediate injury or death, serious health hazards, fires and explosions.

Learn all you can to handle chemicals safely and protect yourself.



Golf Tip of The Week

Perfecting Your Swing

In our previous articles we have talked about some fundamentals of golf, grip and posture. Lets talk a little about the swing. Those that have been around the game of golf for a period of time are familiar with terms like; over the top, out to in, in to out, swing plane, hinging of the wrists. This is all greek to newer golfers. I believe the most important parts of a swing is the take away, impact and finish

- The take away is started by turning your shoulders away from the target, which in turn moves your arms along with your club.
- Good impact is created when your clubface makes contact with the ball square to the target.
- Finish is when your head, chest and hips are facing the target.
- Change any of these elements in your swing and the ball will not take proper flight on a straight, elevated path to the intended target.

Where is a good place to start practicing your swing? Glad you asked. If you are a beginner, before heading out for 18 holes, I would advise you to start practicing your swing on a driving range. It gives you the benefit of hitting balls without having to look for errant shots or feeling embarrassed.

Golfers of all levels, age and ability use the range to work on their swing and if you watch them, you will see that they too have bad shots. If you struggle with teaching yourself the game of golf I would highly recommend seeking out a local Teaching Professional for assistance. It is well worth the money and the feedback and instruction will help you improve your game much quicker.

New conflict and resolution centre opens at 8 Wing

Trenton now has its own Conflict and Complaints Management Services (CCMS) centre.

Operating out of the bottom level of Wing Headquarters, members of 8 Wing will be able to access this new resource any time they need.

As for its primary purpose, the CCMS will provide accessible and personalized conflict and complaint management services. Helping celebrate the centre's arrival, members of 8 Wing Trenton gathered at the Yukon Galley for a soft-launch event, on June 5.

Speaking on how pleased she was to be able to help assist in bringing a centre to Trenton was Meaghan Welfare, the acting regional manager of the Central Region Conflict and Complaint Management Services.

She noted the initiative to bring the services offered by the CCMS to bases, like 8 Wing, was greenlit after a successful testing period in other locations.

"The (CCMS) is a place for members to come when they have any concerns about anything happening in their career and potentially their personal lives as well," she explained. "We can help them find the places to go, the best resources, the best options, with a focus on early, local and informal resolutions."

She went onto explain that issues with pay, concerns about relocation, inter-personal grievances with a co-worker or supervisor were all examples of the types of conflicts the centre would be able to help members with.

"Anything they need assistance with, we will help them navigate the system," said Welfare. "The agents here in Trenton are well-trained and experienced with the Canadian Armed Forces. If at anytime someone is wondering if this is somewhere they should be going or what's next, the best thing they can do is reach out and talk. It's confidential, of course with limitation, and is free of charge."

Also speaking to how thrilled he was to have a CCMS in Trenton was Deputy Wing Commander Lieutenant-Colonel Andre Delhommeau.

"This ensures we have engagement early, locally and informally and will help solve problems for both our members and chain of command," he said. "It's going to be a great program."

Local CCMS agent and supervisor Billie-Jo Stuart chimed in adding that she and her team were looking forward to helping in any way possible. As for the goals the centre hopes to reach in the coming weeks, Stuart said it comes down to networking and

ensuring everyone is aware of their services and feels comfortable accessing it.

"I really want people to feel good about the experience and the services they will receive," she said.

Plans for this compact three-bedroom bungalow include an optional stairway, should the occupants wish to include a basement, always useful for a growing family or a guest room.

The entry, protected from the elements by a dramatic sloped roof supported by a brick pillar, leads into a foyer with a 10-foot ceiling, which carries through the corridor to the great room at the back of the home. (Ceilings in the dining area, the kitchen and the other rooms measure nine feet.)

Sliding glass doors lead from the great room to a covered patio that overlooks

the back garden.

The dining area includes an optional built-out buffet, providing welcome serving and storage space, and is separated from the kitchen by a prep island. 
The master bedroom also includes sliding glass doors to a patio at the back, and has an ensuite with double sinks. The tub and separate shower

Exterior finishes include stucco with wood and brick accents, in addition to a decorative garage door.

Flight Engineers: Fly what you fi

A Flight Engineer (Flt Engr) in the Royal Canadian Air Force (RCAF) really does have the best of both worlds.

The Flt Engr has an active role in air operations as an essential member of the flight crew, and is also a respected advisor to the aircraft commander regarding aircraft technical and maintenance issues.

As such, Flight Engineers face a diverse and rewarding set of challenges and responsibilities that bridge the realms of aerospace operations and aircraft maintenance. They literally do fly what they fix.

Operational environments for Flt Engrs cover an extremely wide range of roles, aircraft types and locations. In the realm of tactical transport, Flt Engrs are part of the team on the Twin Otter, as well as on the Griffon and Chinook helicopters. These fleets carry essential personnel and equipment wherever they need to be, responding to military or humanitarian crises anywhere in Canada and around the globe. In addition, CANSOFCOM's 427 Special Operations Aviation Squadron (SOAS) in Petawawa provides unique and highly challenging experiences for their Flt Engrs.

In the Long Range Patrol role, they fly onboard the upgraded Aurora patrolling Canada's coasts and northern regions, while the aircraft's advanced ISR capabilities can lead to worldwide-deployed operations.

Canada's essential Search and Rescue fleets also rely on Flight Engineers onboard SAR Hercules,

Buffalo, Griffon and Cormorant aircraft. (The crew composition of Canada's new fixed-wing SAR aircraft is yet to be determined.) As part of the SAR crew, they help find and rescue hundreds of people in distress every year, from coast to coast, at sea, and in remote northern locations.

The Flight Engineer occupation is currently seeking motivated men and women to join their ranks. Eligible Flt Engr candidates are drawn from Aviation (AVN) and Avionics (AVS) Technician trades. Once selected, they attend a basic occupation rank qualification course of about 60 training days from which they will be posted to their first squadron. This is followed by operational training specific to the aircraft and role to be flown

The sequence of technician experience followed by additional flight and technical training in the Flt Engr occupation is a natural evolution that makes maximum use skills and knowledge that have been progressively acquired in a member's career. This helps ensure that qualified personnel are ready to operate within the broad range of responsibilities and greater independence associated with Flt Engr duties.

New item on display at the museum

The newest item at the National Air Force Museum of Canada is now on display and ready for the public to learn more about its rich history.

On June 8, the museum became the proud owners of a credence table, originally donated in honour of Lieutenant (Lt.) Colin Coleridge, who died in a plane crash at Camp Mohawk, in 1918.

Lt. Coleridge, originally from Snettisham, England, immigrated to Canada in 1911 and became a member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. As the First World War ravaged on, he then enlisted as a member of the Royal Flying Corps and began his training at Camp Mohawk, in Deseronto.

As a result of his untimely death, his parents had donated a credence table in his memory to the St. Mark's Anglican Church of Deseronto in 1918. The memorial would go onto remain in place for many years, even as the church was deconsecrated in 2001 and later sold as a residence to local historian Paul Robertson and his husband. As a museum curator for the city of Kingston, Robertson noted he had an even greater appreciation of the rich history of the church and its contents when he first purchased it in 2002.

"As a historian, I was very interested in keeping things in place, so in many respects," he explained, "we tried to respect the history of the parish and the people that made that space well over 100 years." Robertson went onto add that the credence table had been one of the many artifacts left behind when the parish closed. The only thing that had been missing from it was the memorial plaque that originally rested in a slot in the table. But not to worry, Robertson was quick to quip

the plaque's whereabouts wasn't such a mystery, as it had in fact been in the safe care of the local Deseronto archives. As the 100th anniversary of the Royal Air Force rolled around, Robertson went onto share he had been contacted by members of 418 (Belleville) Royal Canadian Air Force Association and officials from Lt. Coleridge's hometown of Snettisham, England, with a request to reunite the plaque and the table.

"We're actually selling the church and moving to Kingston, so we thought this was a good opportunity to find a permanent home for the table," said Robertson. "We worked through our local archive to get our board to deaccession the plaque and we of course agreed to donate the table. Now the two are together."

As a historian and curator, Robertson added he had been pleased to see the history of Lt. Coleridge and those who dedicated their lives during the First World War live on.

"These tangible aspects of history are the reminders of their stories and what they brought to life," he said.

Also in attendance at the unveiling of the table at the museum were several officials from Snettisham, England, including parish councillor Stuart Dark.

Dark noted he was delighted to have been able to travel all the way to Trenton to view the table and commemorate the life of Lt. Coleridge.

He went shared that in his town, 1 in 6 men lost their lives during the First World War, with Lt. Coleridge having been just one of them.

"It was a huge impact on village life and the families, sowe wanted to truly remember the people and their sacrifices," he said. "Rather than just remember them back home, we decided to do something where we were coming to them."

Dark and his entourage will be spending the next few months visiting all 45 members of the Snettisham who died while serving abroad. Their journey will take them to three continents, seven countries, and over 25 sites.

"It's a big undertaking but we felt it was absolutely right and we needed to show that we know who these people are, where they are and bring a piece of home to them," he said.

Also having helped organize the delivery of the table was 418 Wing (Belleville) Royal Canadian Air Force Association members Pat and Murray Hope.

For Pat Hope, she said she couldn't have

been happier to have helped get the table to the museum. She added she was hopeful that more people with artifacts in their homes would consider putting them in the care of museums or other public institution so others could enjoy them too.

"The table is now here at the museum and can educate our children," she said. "When I was learning history, it was all out of a book, and it really didn't mean much to us at the time. But now history is tangible and we can relate to it."

The credence table will stay in the care of the museum and will be on display for the foreseeable future.
