# Adopt a military family in need this Christmas

While Christmas should be a time of cheer for families, that's not always the case, says retired Warrant Officer (WO) Sandy Driscoll. Instead, it might be a time of stress and hardship. This can especially hold true in the military community. As the coordinator of the Angela Hayden Adopt a Family Christmas Program (AHAFCP), an initiative aimed at aiding all military families in need, she is once again asking for the community's support.

Driscoll noted that the program is only made possible with the help of the community and members of 8 Wing Trenton. Like in previous years she is asking that squadrons and units step up to "adopt" a family and purchase gifts for the children in need. "It's important that we look out for own," she said. "I recognize that it is difficult to ask for help. But, life happens, and it's about the kids at the end of the day. No child should have to wake up Christmas morning and wonder why Santa didn't visit."

The AHAFCP is not-for-profit program has been in place for more than 20 years and has since helped bring relief to hundreds of families and their children.

"This is meant to be a one-time thing for our reserve or regular force members, as well as DND (Department of National Defence) civilian families, in need," explained WO (ret'd) Driscoll. "It

doesn't always have to be a financial need as sometimes the unexpected happens, such as sickness or an emotional situation, and we want to be there to help when they need a little extra support."

As for what keeps her coming back each year, WO (ret'd) Driscoll said it was the satisfaction of getting to help those in need. In addition, she said it was to help carry on the legacy of Angela Hayden, an 8 Wing Trenton civilian who passed away in a car crash in 2003, and whom the program is named after.

"I don't know if there was a person more giving than she was," said WO (ret'd) Driscoll. "She had been involved in this program before she passed, and it was so important to her. I vowed that I would keep it going for as long as I could."

Speaking to how honoured she has been to volunteer with the program is retired Sergeant (Sgt.) Ashley Martin. She noted that being a part of the program "brings back the magic of Christmas" and is something she encourages all those that are able to take part in. "It's nice to see the goodness come out in people," she said.

"Even if you can help out just once, it's nice to pay kindness forward, and support of military community. You never know when hard times may fall on yourself or someone you know."

In order to benefit from the program, families must apply, or with permission, be recommended by a member of their chain

of command. Families will remain anonymous and only the program coordinator will have people's personal information. The only details given to donors and volunteers will be the age, gender and interests of the children they are buying for. All those who are interested in accessing this program need to apply through their chain of command, a Padre, a SI-SIP financial advisor or through recommendation. Applications are to be submitted by Nov. 22 in order to give the donors time to fundraise and shop. For all other inquiries, contact WO (ret'd) Sandy Driscoll at Sandyd2010@live.ca or 613-243-0646.

# Safety



## Top tips for safe online holiday shopping

Do crowded malls and long lists sap your festive spirit before you even begin your holiday shopping? You're not alone. Online shopping is rapidly growing in popularity across Canada, thanks to its convenience and simplicity. But online fraudsters could ruin your holidays if you're not careful. Be sure to protect yourself from identity theft and fraud. Shop smarter online with these 7 tips

1. Don't click on links to "deals" that are sent via email. Ugg boots at 80 percent off – only if you buy today? Use your common sense. If it's too good to be true, it is probably a "phishing" attack. Shoppers who click through are directed to a fraudulent web site developed to steal their sensitive data. If you want to check on the deal's legitimacy, type the URL directly into your browser instead.

2. Shop only from trusted sources. Stick to well-known online retailers. Use apps downloaded from trusted sources such as Android Market, Apple App Store or the Amazon App Store. When you download the app, it will ask for various "permissions". Don't just click yes; answer carefully. Does a shopping app really need access to your contact list?

3. Ensure your network connection is secure. Most homes and workplaces offer a secure network connection, but public Wi-Fi can be hacked, and your passwords, billing information and sensitive personal data can be exposed. If you don't see "https" in the URL, then the website you're browsing isn't a secure one. If using a public connection, limit yourself to browsing and price comparing, rather than buying. If you need to make your purchase

using a mobile device, use your carrier's data network rather than a Wi-Fi connection.

4. Install and update your anti-virus software: Just as you'd protect your home or wallet from thieves, you need to protect your device and data from intrusion. Make sure your PC or laptop is protected with an up-to-date anti-virus and anti-malware program. And for holiday shopping on the go, don't forget to protect your smartphone with a security app.

5. Lock your devices. Many people leave their devices unlocked, which can expose their personal information to thieves. Most devices request that you lock it with a password or code; take advantage of this feature to keep your information secure.

6. Pay safely: Instead of using your debit card when shopping online this holi-



fraud protection, use a low-limit credit card, or PayPal to pay for your online purchases.

7. Monitor your accounts: If you notice suspicious activity on your bank account or credit cards, report it right away. It's also a good idea to regularly review your online account settings and

often with unique combinations that can't be hacked easily.

### Compare prices and save

Looking for the best price on your online purchase? Use price comparison websites when you shop. Or, compare prices on your mobile device us-

apps. Remember, these sites only have access to the products and prices of retailers with whom they are partnered, so it's a good idea to check a few price comparison sites when searching for something specific. It's like window shopping from the comfort of your own home! Happy holiday shopping!

said he understood the benefit of team building and the positive results it can yield out on the rink. "Camaraderie will bring a team together," he said. "It's great having these players here and an awesome example of the relationship the Base has with the community." Starting off with a visit to the Canadian Army Advanced Warfare Cen-

tre (CAAWC), the athletes got a first-hand look at the how Canadian soldiers train for mountain operations. Donning harnesses and hard hats, the players spent their morning learning to rock climb and repel.

Speaking to how excited he was to have the team on the Base for the second year in a row was Ben Goodman, the Belleville Senators'

senior coordinator of hockey operations. He noted while the players are already well into the season, any opportunity to further encourage teamwork was a welcomed addition. "It's a day away from the rink and the chance to do something a little different," said Goodman. "It's also learning about what the impactful people who work at CFB Trenton do on a daily basis." He added it was an especially exciting opportunity for some of the players who aren't from Canada to get a first-hand look at what the CAF's capabilities are. "I continue to be blown away by what

our armed forces are able to do," he said. "This is an example of an organization that does its best and we as team can definitely learn from that." Also speaking to how thrilled he was to return to 8 Wing Trenton for a day of team development was Jordan Murray, a defenceman in his third year with the Belleville Senators. Having grown up just an hour away from CFB Gagetown in New Brunswick, Murray said he's always had an interest and appreciation for the military. When asked what he and his teammates are hoping to get out of the day, he noted it

was the opportunity to be challenged and the ability to learn more about teamwork from one of Canada's best trained teams. "Today we are getting guys out of their comfort zones," he said. "Hockey, like the military, is similar in the sense that you can't get the job done by yourself. You need your teammates to work together in order to get the job done. It's amazing to see the level of commitment and time put in by the members here at the base." Murray added that the opportunity to come to 8 Wing Trenton was greatly appreciated by all members of his team and

that they were happy to be community ambassadors for Canada's military.

As for Murray's final message to his fellow residents of the Bay of Quinte region, he noted he would encourage everyone, if they are unaware, to take the time to learn more about the military. "They are giving us the ultimate sacrifice with their service for our freedom," said Murray. "It's something that we can take for granted, even though we shouldn't, so take the time to tell them how much we respect them and how proud we are of them. It's an honour to have them serving."





# Shooting competition to be held in support of United Way

It only takes one shot to support the community – literally. On Nov. 29, a pistol shooting competition will take place at 8 Wing Trenton in support of the Government of Canada Charitable Workplace Campaign (GCWCC). The funds raised through this initiative go towards funding programs and services offered by the United Way of Hastings Prince Edward.

Speaking to how excited he is to host the charitable event is Lieutenant (Lt.) Brian Stengele, team captain of the 8 Wing Operational Shooting Team (8 Wg OST) and the RCAF Marksmanship Team. Lt. Stengele noted getting to share what his team is capable of, as well as the aiding the community, was a perfect fit and beneficial to all. “We wanted to do something that was fun and unique,” he said. “Not only will it draw attention to what we do as a team, but, also, to what the Canadian Armed Forces is capable of.” Participants, regardless of experience level, will be able to learn how to properly shoot a Browning 9-mm handgun and compete in a three-match competition. The event, which will take place at 8 Wing Trenton on Nov. 29, is open to military members, law enforcement personnel, armed first responders and any civilians that are legally qualified to handle a firearm. Proof of such qualifications will be required in order to participate. Prior to the competition, participants will also be vetted, and their time on the range supervised by a range safety officer, to ensure maximum safety. “This is a great opportunity to try out the 9-mm in a very safe and controlled environment,” said Lt. Stengele. “We also hope that this might be an opportunity for (military personnel) to learn and grow as members and demonstrate what the CAF is capable of and support the community, all while having some fun. This community does so much for us, and we definitely should be giving back.” In addition to the competition, a silent auction and vendor exposition will also be held on the same day.

As for why someone should consider taking part in the competition, or even to learn more about the shooting team, Lt. Stengele said it came down to trying something new. Having participated in marksmanship over the last decade, Lt. Stengele said he’s been fortunate to take part in several competitions and develop his skill over the years. “It’s very rewarding and if you’re willing to challenge yourself the achievements you can get out of it are unlimited,” he said. “It’s not as simple as it seems. It’s no different than any other sport since there’s

that physical and mental component to it.” He went on to note that the Base team is always happy to welcome new members. The team currently practices twice a week at 8 Wing Trenton on Mondays and Wednesdays. They also utilize the 600-metre range at CFB Kingston on a semi-monthly basis. “There’s no obligation to compete,” he said. “If members just want to come in and increase their skill set, they are more than welcome to do so. We will train them up to the highest level we can, which is Personal Weapons Training 3, the highest level we can obtain with the pistol in the air force.” In addition, the team also trains on the C3A17.62-mm sniper rifle, with training up to Personal Weapons Training 4. “This gives members the opportunity to challenge themselves in a new discipline that is engaging, stimulating and has a lot of benefit for their career,” said Lt. Stengele.

The pistol shooting competition will run from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. and will be hosted at the 25-metre range, located on 27 Buffalo Avenue, at 8 Wing Trenton. 
