## Remembering the 1995 crash of Nimrod XV 239

A small ceremony was held at 8 Wing Trenton on Jan. 9 in remembrance of the victims of Nimrod XV 239 – a maritime patrol aircraft that crashed into Lake Ontario in 1995.

8 Wing Trenton is doing its part to keep the memory of the crew of Nimrod XV 239 alive. On Jan. 9, members joined together in a small ceremony at 2 Air Movements Squadron to learn more about the Royal Air Force (RAF) aircraft's final flight in the summer of 1995. But what made the occasion all the more humbling was the presence of the tail fin of the aircraft

itself – a reminder of how precious life can be. Following a brief history of the Nimrod and its crew, 2 Air Movement Squadron's Padre Lt(N) Glib Pistruga blessed the tail fin before concluding the ceremony. The aircraft piece was then carefully loaded into the back of a CC-177 Globemaster where it would take one last flight – home to Scotland. It was Sept. 2, 1995 when the crew – seven members of the RAF's 120 Squadron based in RAF Kinloss, Scotland – par-

icipated in the Canadian National Exhibition's International Air Show in Toronto. The crew were tasked with displaying the aircraft's capabilities. Spectators at the time reported watching as the aircraft successfully demonstrated turns and a low-level pass over the crowd. But, as the Nimrod approached the end of its display, the same crowd watched in horror as the aircraft then plummeted into Lake Ontario. Having

July began with 437 Transport Squadron's annual visit to the Canadian Warplane Heritage Museum in Hamilton, Ont. This visit was part of the museum's annual Air Force Day – an opportunity to showcase the RCAF's rich aviation history with the community. Members of 437 spent their time giving tours of the CC-150 Polaris and sharing their squadron's history. Also, at the museum, members of 437 took part in the dedication of the C-47 Dakota – the squadron's first aircraft.

The summer months are a busy time for members of the Trenton Cadet Training Centre (TCTC). As they do each year, the cadets held their Ceremonial Trooping of the Banner. This year was made even more special because the cadets were celebrating the 78th year of the Air Cadet program. For many young Canadians, cadets is more than just a recreational program – it's a glimpse into their potential futures. Over at the Mountain View Cadet Flying Training Centre in Prince Edward County, over a dozen young cadets received their Transport Canada Glider Pilot Licence. For many of the 16 and 17 year olds in this program, that is a huge accomplishment,

considering most don't even have their driver's permit. August was also a busy month for the husband and wife duo of the Canadian Forces parachute demonstration team the Sky-Hawks. Master Seaman (MS) Bree Bent and Master Corporal (MCpl) Jason Bent spent their summer touring Canada and the U.S., showcasing and bringing awareness to the Canadian Armed Force's capabilities. Never a dull moment at 424 Transport and Rescue Squadron as August proved to be quite a busy time for its members. Joint Rescue Coordination Centre Trenton responded to a helicopter crash near Gravenhurst on Aug. 10. The helicopter had crashed in a remote forested area of Queen Elizabeth II Wildlands Provincial Park with two passengers on

board. A team from 424 Transport and Rescue Squadron arrived in a CH-146 Griffon Helicopter where they discovered the downed aircraft and were able to retrieve the passengers. At home in Quinte West, members of 424 also participated in the Canal Pursuit – an annual run in support of bringing awareness to mental health. This event is a relay run, 750 kilometres long, starting in Port Severn, Ont. and travelling along the Trent Severn and Rideau Canals, ending at Parliament Hill in Ottawa. To finish off the month, the annual Wounded Warriors Canada Highway of Heroes bike ride took place. More than 65 participants participated in either a 160 or 240-kilometre bike ride in honour of Canada's fallen soldiers.

## September: Childcare, charity and fall celebrations

The month started off in a big way as members of 8 Wing Trenton once again kicked off their annual Government of Canada Workplace Charitable Campaign (GCWCC). To launch the first official day of the initiative, more than 140 participants gathered at the Wing's Roundel Glen Golf Course for the 20th Annual Wing Commander's Golf Challenge on Sept. 5. The GCWCC is an annual event created exclusively for federal public servants and federal retirees looking to make charitable contributions in their communities. Each year, throughout the fall, the Base holds a variety of local events to help raise money for the campaign. The benefactors of the money raised through the GCWCC are HealthPartners and the United Way of Hastings Prince Edward. The campaign concluded a few months later, with 8 Wing having raised over \$103,000.

The lives of fallen paramedics were also honoured in a ceremony at Bain Park in Quinte West on Sept. 14. The event was part of the Paramedic Ride Ontario initiative - an annual bike

ride, first conceptualized in 2012, that aims to raise awareness and funds for the Canadian Paramedic Memorial Foundation. More than 200 cyclists from 30 different paramedic services across Ontario stopped in for last year's ceremony.

Members of Personnel Support Programs (PSP) and Health Promotion took the month of September to reiterate the importance of staying active and fit. Together, they coordinated the annual CAF Sports Day at 8 Wing Trenton. On this day, members got the chance to step away from the workplace and enjoy a day of recreational activities including sports, yoga and more. At the event, 8 Wing Commander Colonel Ryan Deming spoke on the importance of remaining fit for both operational readiness and good overall mental health.

Over at local French immersion school, École secondaire publique Marc-Garneau, students celebrated Franco-Ontarian Day. Each year, members of the Franco-Ontario community gather to celebrate their more than 400 years of history and culture in Canada. Outside of Quebec, Ontario has one of the largest francophone communities in the country. The an-

niversary of the Franco-Ontario flag, a symbol of the collaboration of cultures, was also celebrated as it was first flown in 1975. It features a green band with a fleur-de-lis and a white band with a trillium.

September was also a great month for the Trenton Military Family Resource Centre. To start things off, they officially held their grand opening for their newest location in Batawa. Addressing a growing need for childcare in the region, staff at the time say it was a welcomed addition. The new 5,000 square foot facility boasts ample natural lighting, several fenced-in outdoor play areas, spacious playrooms and close proximity to Batawa Ski Hill and biking and hiking trails. The childcare facility can hold up to 75 licensed childcare positions. To finish off the month, the MFRC held their annual Family Day Block Party. This was an opportunity to give a final farewell to summer and a hello to all the new military families in the community. Also celebrating September, members of CFS Alert held a fall carnival. While the event was morale-boosting, it was also an opportunity to raise funds for Wounded Warrior Canada.

## October: Town halls, celebrating fall and a hidden RCAF treasure

As the end of the year began to draw near, October was a great time for members to reflect on the fantastic year so far. With just a few months left, they ensured to keep pace and continue to work hard both at home and abroad. The month started with a visit from Royal Canadian Air Force (RCAF) Commander Lieutenant-General Al Meinzinger. During this time, he held a town hall where one of the messages he shared was the importance of innovation and the future of the RCAF. In addition, he welcomed members to share their ideas and ask questions.

Also in October, the remainder of the Air Task Force members deployed on Canada's peacekeeping operations in Mali returned home. Prior to their arrival, family and friends quickly began filling the passenger air terminal in anticipation. While overseas, Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) members primarily aided in aero-medical evacuations and aerial transportation of United Nations forces in what is known

as Op PRESENCE.

October was an eventful month for the ongoing Government of Canada Charitable Workplace Campaign (GCWCC). Several events were held throughout the month on Base. This included the annual Hercules' aircraft pull. This event saw teams trying to pull a CC-130 Hercules aircraft by rope in the fastest time. Hundreds stopped in at Hangar 1 on the Base's north side to watch as the teams flexed their collective strength.

The annual Poppy Campaign also kicked off at Quinte West City Hall. Led by members of Royal Canadian Legion Branch 110, this event holds significance for many reasons, said Legion president retired Master Corporal Douglas Duff. "The poppy is a symbol of caring and our freedom," he said at the time. "I would encourage everyone, especially the younger generation, to learn more about it so they understand the cost it took so we may enjoy the life we live."

To finish off the month, the National Air Force Museum of Canada came into pos-

session of an exceptionally rare artifact - a membership card to the caterpillar club, an artifact as rare as it is significant in the aviation community. The caterpillar club, first conceptualized in 1922, was created in part by parachutist Leslie Irvin - founder of the Irving Air Chute Company. Its purpose was to act as an exclusive club for anyone whose life had been saved by a parachute as a result of a stricken aircraft. The card was found by Loyalist College employee Jeremy Braithwaite in the back of an old truck that was once used for garbage disposal at the school in the late 1980s. The card belonged to Squadron Leader (S/Ldr) John E. Mahoney, a member of the Royal Air Force who joined in 1937, where he served as pilot in England, Egypt and India. He would later go on to move to Canada and join the Royal Canadian Air Force. As luck would have it, the NAFMC was already home to more than 200 artifacts of S/Ldr Mahoney's. As for how the card ended up in an old truck, forgotten for many years, well, that might just remain one of life's many mysteries.



lost their lives in the incident were Flight Lieutenant (Flt.-Lt.) Dom Gilbert, Flt.-Lt. Glenn Hooper, Sergeant (Sgt.) Gary Moxham, Flt.-Lt. Nick Brooks, Sgt. Richie Williams, Sgt Craig Barnett and Flt.-Lt. Bernie Worthington. Speaking to how important it was to commemorate the airmen who lost their lives in the crash was Major (Maj.) Trevor Reid. He noted it was an honour to be able to carry on their memory and one that would not be taken lightly. "It's important to remember those that gave their lives in service to their country," he said. "We have an excellent relationship with the RAF and certainly the loss of these members struck a lot of RCAF members very closely when it happened. Our part here is to ensure this aircraft part gets overseas in a respectful man-

ner, especially noting its importance to the fallen member's families." Maj. Reid went onto explain that following the crash, the tail fin piece of the aircraft had been placed in an aerospace museum in Toronto. Following the closure of the museum some years later, the artifact then came into the possession of an individual who stored it at the Norwood Municipal Airport. Noting its significance to the Royal Air Force and a museum in Scotland which commemorates the Nimrod aircraft and the crews that served on it, the RCAF worked hard to see if it could be returned to its rightful place. "This is now going to be going to a museum in Scotland (Morayvia Science and Technology Centre), where it will be included in a commemorative display" said Maj. Reid.






